AT the Court at St. James's, the 18th of September; 1793,

PREŠENT;

'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council bearing Date the Thirteenth of March, 1793, to order, that an Embargo fhould be forthwith laid upon all Ships or Veffels laden or to be laden in any of the Ports of Great Britain with Salted Provisions of any Kind whatfoever, and also upon all Ships and Vessels laden or to be laden with Butter and Cheefe, Peafe, Beans, Rice, Hay, Straw, or Forage of any Kind whatfoever; and with Hides or Leather manufactured or unmanufactured; but it was His Majefty's Pleasure, amongst other Things, that the faid Embargo should not extend to any Ships or Veffels, being British Ships and Veffels, and navigated according to Law, which may be employed in carrying any of the Articles abovementioned to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty: And whereas it hath been represented, on Behalf of the Merchants concerned in the Exportation of Tanned Leather, and also of the Merchants concerned in the Exportation of Salted Pilchards, and other Salted Fifh, that the Trade in the faid feveral Articles will be greatly injured, if fuch Articles are not permitted to be exported in Foreign Ships, under proper Regulations; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the Date hereof, the Exportation of Tanned Leather, and also of Salted Pilchards, and other Salted Fish, shall, notwithstanding the faid

ted and allowed from any of the Ports in this Kingdom to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majefty, in Foreign Ships or Veffels, provided the Merchant Exporter of any fuch Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fifh; do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which fuch Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fifh, fhall be entered Outwards; before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, with Two fufficient Sureties, being known British Merchants, or other Perfons of acknowledged Credit refident in this Kingdom, to be approved of by the proper Officers of the Cuitoms, to carry the faid Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fifth, to the Place for which the fame are respectively entered Outwards, and to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of the Bond, from the British Conful relident at the Port for which fuch Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, shall be cleared out; or, in cafe there shall be no fuch Conful there resident, or he shall be ablent from the fame, then from Two British Merchants refident there, a Certificate or Certificates that fuch Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, have been all duly delivered at the Ports for which the fame were cleared out; and fuch Bonds or Securities shall not be cancelled or delivered up but on the Production of fuch Certificate or Certificates. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

#### Whitehall, September 21.

HIS Morning one of His Majefly's Mellengers arrived at the Office of the Right Honorable Lord Grenville, His Majefly's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, with Difpatches from the Earl of Elgin, His Majefty's Envoy Extraordinary to the Court of Brussels, of which the following is an Extract.

#### St. Amand, September 16, 1793.

I Have the Honor of encloing to your Lordihip the Report of the Recapture of Menin, as fent in by General Beaulieu to Prince Cobourg.

#### September 15, 1793.

THIS Morning the French, to the Number of Twelve or Fourteen Thoufand Men, advanced from Wevelghem to Biffeghein, where they attacked the Advanced Polts on the Left of General Beaulieu's The Attack was brifk, and would have com-Army. pleatly succeeded on the Side of the French, if General Beaulieu had not fent speedy and fucceffive Re-in-forcements to the Post of Biffeghem. The French had then Recourse to their numerous Artillery," in order to dillodge the Auftrians from their Polition behind the Landerbeg ; and they would have been fuccessful there, if they had not fuddenly found their Left turned by a Body of Auftrian Infantry, headed by Captain Malksham, of the Regiment of Beaulieu, who attacked them with Cannon on the Left Flank, and also in the Rear. This Movement of the Au-trians on the Left Flank of the French had fuch an Effect upon the latter, that they began to give Way. General Beaulieu then availing himfelf of this Cir-cumitance, charged them in Front, and put them totally to Flight. They retreated towards Menn. General Beaulieu having collected his Cavality, which had routed the French, waited for Reports from his Right, in order to be affured that he might purfue the Enemy without Interruption. The Reports arrived about One o Clock, P. M. In confequence, General Beaulieu, without a Moment's Hesitation, marched towards Menin; the rather as he had learnt that General Ehrbach, with Four Battalions and Eight Squadrons, was on his March from Rouflaer. In the Purfuit General Beaulieu's Ad-vanced Guard had feveral Skirmishes, in which it had constantly the Advantage, repulsing the Ehemy quite to the Gates of Menin. At Fror in the Afternoon General Beaulieu arrived with his whole Corps under the Walls of that Town, and attacked the French with Cannon; at the fame Time he affaulted the Ramparts near the Gate of Royflaer, when the French, without any further Refiftance, totally abandoned the Place, and palled the Lys with Precipitation, leaving at the Bridge only a weak Rear-Guard, which was entirely killed or taken by the Auffrian Troops, who entered at the Gate of Courtray." In this Interval General Ehrbach arrived with his Corps, and immediately paffed the Lys. Two English Squadrons joined the Austrian Hussiars Two Englin Squadrons joined the Autrian Humars in the Purfuit of the French, who retreated towards Roneq. In this Action we loft about One Hun-dred Men, killed or wounded. The Lofs of the French is between Four and Five Hundred Men. We are not able at prefent to compute the Number-of Philomers. At the Departure of the Mefleoger, who brought this agreeable Intelligence, about 150 were arrived in the Square of Menin, together with Two Pieces of Cannon, and Eighteen Ammunition Waggons.

'HE following Difpatch from Colonel Sir James Murray, Adjutant General to the Forces under the Command of His Royal Highness the Duke of York, was this Afternoon received at the Office of the Right Honrable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

#### Menin, September 17, 1793.

I HAD the Honor of informing you, that upon the Retreat of the Dutch Troops from Menin, His Royal Highnels intended to march upon Thouroute, in order to oppose the further Progress of the Enemy, and to act in Conjunction with General Beaulieur, who commanded a Corps of Auftrians near Courtray.

This March was executed upon the 14th. Lieu-tenant-General Erbach, with Two Battalions of Auftrians and Two of Heffian Infantry, and Four Squadrons of British Cavalry, under the Command. of Major-General Harcourt, was ordered to advance the fame Day to Roufelaire. Upon the 15th the Main Body of the Army advanced to Roufelaire, and Lieutenant-General Erbach's Corps to Ledeghem, it being His Royal Highnels's Intention to attack the Enemy, and force them to repais the Lys. Infor-mation was received at Roufelaire of the Prince of Cobourg's being in March towards Liffe with a large Body of Troops, which His Serene Highnels had put in Motion, as foon as he had learnt that Menin was evacuated.

During the March of the Army, the Enemy had attacked General Beaulieu's Advanced Posts; Eight Battalions were fent to his Support ; but the Enemy had been repulfed before their Arrival:

This appears to been only intended to cover their Retreat, as they had begun to evacuate Menin early in the Morning. In the Course of the Day they enin the Morning. In the Court of the Anny which was taken Possession of in the Evening by Lieutenant-General Erbach. Yefferday the Army marched again: A Camp was taken near Menin, and the ad-vanced Pofts pufled on to Werwick, which the Enemy had likewife abandoned, fo that by thefe Movements Austrian Flanders has been protected, and this Part of it recovered.

### Admiralty Office, September 21.

A Letter hath this Day been received from Vice-Admiral Lord Hood, Commander in Chief of His Majefty's Ships and Veffels in the Mediterranean, to Mr. Stephens, dated on board the Victory, in the Outer Road of Toulon, the 1st Instant, of which the following is an Extract.

Y Efferday Afternoon a Part of Carteaux's Army, 1 confilting of 750 Men, approached near Toulon. Captain Elphinstone, whom I had appointed Governor of the Great Fort of Malgue and it's Dependencies, marched out, at the Head of 600 Troops, and put it to the Rout, took Four Pieces of Cannon, their Ammunition, &c.

Herewith I have the Honor to fend you Governor Elphinftone's Letter; and most exceedingly lament the Lofs of a very excellent Officer, Major Douglas, whom I had appointed Fort-Major, and whole Zeal for going out with the Troops could not be reftrained ... The Ball entered his Breaft, and was extracted at the Shoulder Blade. He died last Night.

Upon the Treeps leaving the Fort, the appointed Signal was made for a Number of Seamen that were kept ready, and 400 were on Shore immediately, to put the Fort out of Danger.

Rear-Admiral Goodall has taken upon him the Charge and Command of Governor of Toulon, and Rear-Admiral Gravina that of Commandant of the Troops.

The Signal is, this Moment, for the Convoy's being in Sight, with a confiderable Body of Spanish Troops, from the Army in Roufillon.

Toulon, August 31, 1793.

MY LORD, IN confequence of the Information I had the Ho-"nor to fend your Lordship Yesterday Forenoon, and the repeated Applications which I had received from the Committee of War and Safety, I thought proper to fend out a Patrole towards Ollouiles, to reconnoitre the Enemy and to examine their Force; at the fame Time I ordered 300 British, and the fame Number of Spanish Troops, to be under Arms, and I directed the Committee of War to furnish a Proportion of their belt Troops, and Six Pieces of Cannon, with Ammunition and Waggons, to be in Reaeinefs. About Three o'Clock the Patrole returned with fome Peafants; who had been wounded by the Enemy's Dragoons, who informed me that certain Troops of Carteaux were posted at Senary and l'Ollouiles, about Five Miles from hence, to the Amount of 600 Men, with Ten Pieces of Cannon, and a few Cavalry : I instantly marched out with the British and Spanish Troops, taking the Road to Ollouiles, having Four Guides along with me (belonging to that Place) and having left Directions that the French Troops, with the Cannon, &c. fhould inftantly follow. On the Road I met wounded Peafants, who informed me that their whole Force was now posted in Ollouiles. When we approached within Half a Mile of that Place, I observed a Party of the Enemy endeavouring to gain an Eminence on our Right. I detached Captain Haddon and Wemys, of the 11th Regiment of Foot, to prevent this, and to advance with their Parties, keeping Possefilon of the high Grounds, and fent Lieutenant Knight, with a Party of the fame Regiment, on the like Service, to the Left, both of which Duties were admirably executed. I then advanced with the Aide du Camp to reconnoitre the Enemy's Situation, and found they were posted in the Village of l'Ollouiles, upon the Side of a fteep Hill, a deep Ravine in their Front, with a Stone Bridge over it, defended with Two Pieces of Can-non, and the Windows filled with Mulfquetry; about Two Hundred Yards further up the Hill, at a ruinous Callle, there were Two more Pieces of Cannon, and the Walls of the Vineyards lined with Mufquetry. It was now Half paft Six in the Evening, without any Appearance of the French Troops or the Cannon from Toulon; it became therefore necessary, either to attack immediately or to retire : I preferred the former, and-ordered the Flanking Patty to keep up an inceffant Firing upon the Can-non at the Bridge; I then ordered the Column, under Cover of a Stone Wall, cautiously to advance within Two Hundred Yards, and then, being open to the Fire of the Enemy, to rush forward, which was executed under a very fevere Fire; when the Enemy inflantly abandoned their Pofts, on all Quarters, leaving us in Poffeffion of their Cannon, Horses and Ammunition, Two Stand of Colours, Drums, &c. Drums, &c. They were purfued up a very fleep Fill to the further End of the Village. It was now become nearly dark, and the Ammunition was ex-pended, which induced me to order the Troops to occupy the Eminence, as we were in an unknown

Country, and abandoned by the Guides (who fied upon the first Fire. After halting for an Hour, I led the Troops back to Toulon, with the Prifoners and Cannon taken from the Enemy, and on the Road we met the French Troops and the Cannon, which ought to have left Toulon with us, but which unfortunately had been delayed. From the Information that we received in the Village, and from the Prisoners, we found that we had beaten the *Elite* of Cartcaux' Army, confifting of between Seven and Eight Hundred Men and fome Cavalry, which had been fent from Marleilles, for the Purpole of overawing Toulon, and that they expected to have been joined the next Day by 400 Men, and 8 Pieces of Cannon. In this little Affair, it becomes my Duty to inform your Lordhip, that the Conduct of the Troops, those of His Majefly as well as those of the King of Spain, was highly meritorious. Captain Moncrief, of the 11th, Commandant of the British Troops, headed the Column with a Degree of Intrepidity worthy of Imitation; and Don Monteiro, Com-mandant of the Spanish Troops, conducted himself with equal Valour. But the Credit of the Day was chiefly derived from the great Exertion and gallant Behaviour of Captain Douglas, Town-Ma-jor of Toulon; and it is with Grief I add, that he was mortally wounded, and is finee dead : In my Mind, the King's Service has fuftained a great Lofs. The Conduct of Enfign Forster, of the 30th Regiment, my Aide du Camp, was fuch as to give me the fulleft Satisfaction, and hope will render him an Object of Attention.
