P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council bearing Date the Thirteenth of March, 1793, to order, that an Embargo should be forthwith laid upon all Ships or Vessels laden or to be laden in any of the Ports of Great Britain with Salted Provisions of any Kind whatsoever, and also upon all Ships and Vessels laden or to be laden with Butter and Cheese, Pease, Beans, Rice, Hay, Straw, or Forage of any Kind whatsoever, and with Hides or Leather manufactured or unmanufactured; but it was His Majesty's Pleasure, amongst other Things, that the said Embargo should not extend to any Ships or Vessels, being British Ships and Vessels, and navigated according to Law, which may be employed in carrying any of the Articles abovementioned to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty: And whereas it hath been represented, on Behalf of the Merchants concerned in the Exportation of Tanned Leather, and also of the Merchants concerned in the Exportation of Salted Pilchards, and other Salted Fish, that the Trade in the said several Articles will be greatly injured, if such Articles are not permitted to be exported in Foreign Ships, under proper Regulations; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the Date hereof, the Exportation of Tanned Leather, and also of Salted Pilchards, and other Salted Fish, shall, notwithstanding the said

Order of the Thirteenth of March last, be permitted and allowed from any of the Ports in this Kingdom to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty, in Foreign Ships or Vessels, provided the Merchant Exporter of any such Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which such Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, with Two sufficient Sureties, being known British Merchants, or other Persons of acknowledged Credit resident in this Kingdom, to be approved of by the proper Officers of the Customs, to carry the said Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, to the Place for which the same are respectively entered Outwards, and to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of the Bond, from the British Consul resident at the Port for which such Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, shall be cleared out; or, in case there shall be no such Consul there resident, or he shall be absent from the same, then from Two British Merchants resident there, a Certificate or Certificates that such Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, have been all duly delivered at the Ports for which the same were cleared out; and such Bonds or Securities shall not be cancelled or delivered up but on the Production of such Certificate or Certificates. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

*Extract of a Letter from the Earl of Yarmouth to the Right Honorable Lord Grenville, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Department of Foreign Affairs. Dated Maikammer, September 15, 1793.*

**A**N Aid-de-Camp of the Duke of Brunswick is just arrived, with an Account that the Duke of Brunswick was Yesterday attacked by the French near Pirmazens, but that, by a very judicious Manœuvre, he turned their Flank so compleatly as to surround them, when they threw down their Arms and surrendered themselves Prisoners of War, to the Amount of 3000. He took 27 Pieces of Cannon and Two Howitzers. The Number of the Dead cannot be ascertained, as the Duke was left in the Pursuit. He also was so fortunate, in the Course of the Operations, as to burn the Baggage and Tents of another Body of French, encamped near Bitche. While the Duke was so well employed on one Side, General Kalkreuth was attacked in another Quarter, but very faintly; and the Action concluded by his cutting to Pieces the Regiment emphatically called *les Sans Culottes*, and taking 67 Men of another Corps.
