AT the Court at St. James's, the 18th of September, 1793,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council bearing Date the Thirteenth of March, 1793, to order, that an Embargo should be forthwith laid upon all Ships or Vessels laden or to be laden in any of the Ports of Great Britain with Salted Provisions of any Kind whatfoever, and also upon all Ships and Vessels laden or to be laden with Butter and Cheese, Pease, Beans, Rice, Hay, Straw, or Forage of any Kind whatfoever, and with Hides or Leather manufactured or unmanufactured; but it was His Majesty's Pleasure, amongst other Things, that the said Embargo should not extend to any Ships or Vessels, being British Ships and Vessels, and navigated according to Law, which may be employed in carrying any of the Articles abovementioned to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty: And whereas it hath been represented, on Behalf of the Merchants concerned in the Exportation of Tanned Leather, and also of the Merchants concerned in the Exportation of Salted Pilchards, and other Salted Fish, that the Trade in the faid feveral Articles will be greatly injured, if such Articles are not permitted to be exported in Foreign Ships, under proper Regulations; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the Date hereof, the Exportation of Tanned Leather, and also of Salted Pilchards, and other Salted Fish, shall, notwithstanding the said

Order of the Thirteenth of March last, be permitted and allowed from any of the Ports in this Kingdom to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty, in Foreign Ships or Vessels, provided the Merchant Exporter of any fuch Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which fuch Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majelty's Customs, with Two sufficient Sureties, being known British Merchants, or other Persons of acknowledged Credit refident in this Kingdom, to be approved of by the proper Officers of the Customs, to carry the faid Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, to the Place for which the same are respectively entered Outwards, and to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of the Bond, from the British Consul resident at the Port for which fuch Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, shall be cleared out; or, in case there shall be no such Consul there resident, or he shall be absent from the same, then from Two British Merchants resident there, a Certificate or Certificates that fuch Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, have been all duly delivered at the Ports for which the fame were cleared out; and fuch Bonds or Securities shall not be cancelled or delivered up but on the Production of such Certificate or Certificates. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HIS Day the Right Honorable Sir Gilbert Elliot, Baronet, was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Whitehall, September 28.

BY a Dispatch, received last Night from the Right Honorable Lord Mulgrave, dated Toulon, September 8, 1793, it appears that his Lordship had arrived there on the 6th, and had been defired by Lord Hood to take upon himself the Command of the Troops until His Majesty's Pleasure should be It further appears that One of the Advanced Polls, appearing to be out of the regular Military Line of Defence, it had been determined to evacuate it; but before the Order for carrying that Measure into Execution arrived, Carteaux, the General of the Republican Party, (who had collected about 5000 Men from Marfeilles and Nice to harrass this Garrison) attacked the Post, and drove back the Spaniards who had occupied it, with the Loss of 35 Men killed, Two Officers and 20 Men wounded, One Officer and 15 Men missing. Of Two Priests, who went out after the Action to give Absolution to the Wounded, One has been found murdered, and the other is missing. The Corps at this Post conthe other is missing. The Corps at this Post confished of 400 Spanish Troops, and 150 of the French National Guards from Toulon. A Detachment of the British Brigade were marched out of Toulon to cover their Retreat, which Service they performed without Difficulty, having only One Private Soldier wounded.
