P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council bearing Date the Thirtieth of March, 1793, to order, that an Embargo should be forthwith laid upon all Ships or Vessels laden or to be laden in any of the Ports of Great Britain with Salted Provisions of any Kind whatsoever, and also upon all Ships and Vessels laden or to be laden with Butter and Cheese, Pease, Beans, Rice, Hay, Straw, or Forage of any Kind whatsoever, and with Hides or Leather manufactured or unmanufactured; but it was His Majesty's Pleasure, amongst other Things, that the said Embargo should not extend to any Ships or Vessels, being British Ships and Vessels, and navigated according to Law, which may be employed in carrying any of the Articles abovementioned to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty: And whereas it hath been represented, on Behalf of the Merchants concerned in the Exportation of Tanned Leather, and also of the Merchants concerned in the Exportation of Salted Pilchards, and other Salted Fish, that the Trade in the said several Articles will be greatly injured, if such Articles are not permitted to be exported in Foreign Ships, under proper Regulations; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the Date hereof, the Exportation of

Tanned Leather, and also of Salted Pilchards, and other Salted Fish, shall, notwithstanding the said Order of the Thirtieth of March last, be permitted and allowed from any of the Ports in this Kingdom to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty, in Foreign Ships or Vessels, provided the Merchant Exporter of any such Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which such Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, with Two sufficient Sureties, being known British Merchants, or other Persons of acknowledged Credit resident in this Kingdom, to be approved of by the proper Officers of the Customs, to carry the said Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, to the Place for which the same are respectively entered Outwards, and to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of the Bond, from the British Consul resident at the Port for which such Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, shall be cleared out; or, in case there shall be no such Consul there resident, or he shall be absent from the same, then from Two British Merchants resident there, a Certificate or Certificates that such Tanned Leather and Salted Pilchards, or other Salted Fish, have been all duly delivered at the Ports for which the same were cleared out; and such Bonds or Securities shall not be cancelled or delivered

up but on the Production of such Certificate or Certificates. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

*Extract of a Letter received Yesterday by the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, from the Right Honorable Lord Mulgrave, dated Toulon, September 16.*

Nothing of Importance has occurred since my Letter of September 8. The Enemy have been constantly in Sight, and have pushed their Patrols very near our Out-Posts, from whom we have occasionally taken a few Prisoners; but we have remained on our Part constantly on the Defensive, to avoid fatiguing the Troops, who continue in good Health. The Redoubts and Forts at the Out-Posts are in general so considerably strengthened as to leave little to apprehend from any offensive Efforts of the Enemy; though no Part of the Reinforcements, which were required from different Quarters, were arrived.

On the 15th the Enemy marched a considerable Corps of Troops, of which about 400 Infantry and 200 Cavalry passed in Sight of our Posts from the East Side of the Town, to reinforce Cartaux's Main Body, which is posted on the Hills to the Westward. I am certain of the cordial Co-operation of the Spanish Admiral Gravina, who commands the Troops of his Nation on Shore, and whose active Zeal, accommodating Disposition, and even Temper, give every possible Facility to the Execution of the Public Service, and the Support of the Common Cause.

It is with the highest Satisfaction I inform you that the British Troops have very particularly distinguished themselves by their moderate Conduct and orderly Behaviour. From the Inhabitants I have hitherto only heard Praises of their good Order.

*Extract of a Letter from the Earl of Elgin, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary at the Court of Brussels, to the Right Honorable Lord Grenville, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, dated Haumont, September 29, 1793.*

It is with the utmost Satisfaction that I have it in my Power to inform your Lordship of the complete Success with which His Serene Highness Prince Cobourg has this Day passed the Sambre, driven into the entrenched Camp of Maubeuge all the detached Corps of French, and formed the Investment of the Camp and Fortrefs.

The Army was in March at Day-break. General Clairfayt's Column crossed at Brelaimort, and having met with very little Resistance, was, in a very short Time, in the Position, which according to the Disposition it was meant to take, between Aulnois and Baschamp.

The Column of General Colloredo crossed at Pont and Haumont, and so effectually were the Enemy surprised in the Camp of St. Remy Malbati, that their Tents and Baggage were taken. The Rout soon began, but the Pursuit was interrupted by great Inequalities in the Ground, and, accordingly, the Loss of the French in killed and wounded, and in

Prisoners, did not exceed the Number of 200 Men. The Austrians, however, took Nine Pieces of Cannon. General Colloredo has pitched his Camp between Haumont and the Bois de Beaufort, both of which he occupies.

General de la Tour crossed the Sambre between Jeumont and Marpeut, and with a Degree of Success similar to that of General Colloredo's Column, as he surprised the Enemy's Camp at Bequignies. He took some Prisoners, and Two Pieces of Cannon; and as his March was not much impeded by the Nature of the Country, he killed 300 Men. He has advanced to Cerfontaine, where he has taken up his Position: He occupies the Forest of Bonpere, near Ronfies, and his Left Flank extends by Terrere la Petite, towards the Corps of General Colloredo, with whom he is at this Moment forming a Junction. Colonel Seckendorff, who marched from Charleroy, has advanced, without much Resistance, to Collnet.

Prince Cobourg's Head Quarters are at Haumont.

In a Word, every Object proposed in this Enterprize has been obtained, and with the Loss of 50 Men killed and wounded: Two or Three Officers are slightly wounded.

*As several Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His present Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur, by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to those who are in any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments, used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.*

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

**I**F any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Assizes or Quarter-Sessions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Person having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the said Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be,

or

or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; such Persons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to seduce any such Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majesty's Dominions, for the Purposes aforesaid, such Justice may send his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the said Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions: And, if such Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any such Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any such Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpose aforesaid, he shall give such Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the same shall be prosecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

*Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.*

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to seduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery, at the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireland; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or seduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in Case of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any such Tools or Utensils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up

or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of such Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and secure, in some of His Majesty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall find on Board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools so seized shall, after Condemnation, be publicly sold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall seize and secure the same.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the said Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vessel, he shall, for every such Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and, if the Vessel belongs to His Majesty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly suffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or sign any Cocket or Suffrance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the said Tools, or knowingly suffer the same to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforesaid, and also forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.

*Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His present Majesty.*

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to Persons packing or putting on board any Vessel, not bound directly for some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Press, Paper, Utensil or Implement whatsoever, used in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Linen, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of such Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Persons receiving or being in Possession of any such Articles, with an Intent to export the same to Foreign Parts, and all Custom-house Officers suffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Case of Tools and Utensils used in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
