AT the Court at St. James's, the 9th of October, 1793, PRESENT,

R The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS the Inhabitants of the City and Port of Toulon in France have delivered to Vice-Admiral Lord Hood, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Mediterranean, Possefion of the faid City and Port, and their Dependencies; and the faid Vice-Admiral Lord Hood hath taken Poffeffion thereof accordingly; and the fame are no longer under the Government of the Perfons now exercifing the Powers of Government in France, but are under the Protection of His Majefty: And whereas it is expedient that the Inhabitants within the faid City and Port, and their Dependencies, should be supplied with Articles necesfary for their Suftenance, Accommodation and Defence, notwithstanding the present War between Great Britain and France; His Majesty, taking the Premifes into His Royal Confideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the Date hereof, until His Majefly's Pleafure fhall be fignified to the contrary, all His loving Subjects may lawfully trade to and with the faid City. and Port of Toulon, and the Dependencies thereof, notwithstanding the War between Great Britain and France, except only in fuch Manner as by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act more effectually to prevent, during the " present War between Great Britain and France, "all Traiterous Correspondence with, or Aid or "Affiltance being given to His Majefty's Enese mies," is prohibited, and is not hereinafter fpe-

cially authorized ; fubject, neverthelefs, to the fame Regulations, Conditions, Reftrictions, Duties, Penalties and Forfeitures, as the faid Trade was liable to, immediately before the Commencement of the faid War. And whereas by the faid Act, during the Continuance of the prefent War between Great Britain and France, all Perfons refiding or being in Great Britain are prohibited, under the Penalties of High-Treason, from supplying, to or for the Ufe of any Perfon or Perfons refiding or being within any of the Dominions of France, or any Town, Territory, Port or Place annexed to France, or under the Government of the Perfons then exercifing, or who might thereafter, during the faid War, exercife the Powers of Government in France, divers Articles specified in the faid Act, without Licence from His Majefty, under His Sign Manual, or by Order in Council or Proclamation first had and obtained, fpecifying the Articles with refpect to which the fame shall be had and obtained, and also the Place and Places from which and to which the faid Articles shall be fent ; His Majesty is pleased further, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that it shall be lawful to and for all Perfons reliding or being in Great Britain, to fell, fupply and deliver, from any Port or Place in Great Britain, or in any Part of His Mujefty's Dominions in Europe, or in any Country in Amity with His Majefty, to the Port of Toulon aforfaid, Wheat, Wheat-Meal or Flour, Barley, Barley-Meal or Flour, Oats ground or unground, Peafe, Beans, Rye or Rye-Meal (fuch Wheat, Wheat-Meal or Flour, Barley, Barley-Meal or Flour, Oats ground or unground, Peafe, Beans, Rye or Rye-Meal, if exported from Great Britain, and of Britifh Growth, not being otherwife prohibited from being

being exported from Great Britain at the Time of fuch intended Exportation) or Potatoes, or any Flefh or Fifh, frefh or falted, or Cheefe or Butter, or Beer, Ale, Cyder or Perry, or Wine, Brandy or other Spirituous Liquors; or Hay, Straw, or Forage, or Maize, or Rice ground or unground; or Sugar or Rum, or Coffee, Tea, Chocolate, Cocoa; or Tobacco or Spices, or any Goods or Commodities of the Growth, Production or Manufacture of the East Indies, which shall have been first legally imported into this Kingdom; or Sadlery, Boots or Shoes, or Leather wrought or unwrought; or any other Article of British Manufacture whatever, not being Naval or Military Stores; it being His Majefty's Pleafure, that Naval or Military Stores shall not be exported or fent to the faid Port of Toulon, by virtue hereof, without special Licence from His Majesty, under His Sign Manual, or by Order in Council: And also to fell, fupply and deliver any Gold or Silver Bullion, or any Notes or Bills of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England; and also to fell, fupply and deliver from the Island of Newfoundland and it's Dependencies, and from any of His Majefty's Provinces or Colonies in North America, to the faid Port of Toulon, any falted Fifh taken or caught by British Subjects, any Thing in the before mentioned Act to the contrary notwithstanding ; subject, nevertheles, to the fame Regulations, Conditions, Reftrictions, Duties, Penalties and Forfeitutes, as the Trade in the faid feveral Articles, herein before enumerated or defcribed, was liable to immediately before the Commencement of the prefent War : Provided always, that all Commodities whatfoever, fent to the Port of Toulon in Manner herein before authorized, shall, if exported from Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or from the Port of Gibraltar, or from the Island of Newfoundland or it's Dependencies, or from any of His Majefty's Provinces or Colonies in North America, be exported only in British Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; and provided alfo, that the Perfon or Perfons, who shall export any of the faid Commodities from any of the Ports of Great Britain; or of the faid Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or from the Port of Gibraltar, shall, before the Entry of the same for Exportation, give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Collector or Principal Officer of His Majefty's Cultoms at the Port from which fuch Articles refpectively shall be exported; or if exported from Gibraltar, to the Satiffaction of the Governor or Commander in Chief at Gibraltar for the Time being, with Two fufficient Sureties, being known British Merchants or other Perfons of acknowledged Credit, with Condition that fuch Commodities shall be fent to the Port of Toulon only, and there delivered ; and also to con-1. 5

form, on Arrival at the faid Port of Toulon, to all fuch Rules and Regulations as shall be established there by the Commissioners appointed to act, in His Majefty's Name and Behalf, in fuperintending, managing and directing the Civil Affairs and Concerns of the faid City and Port of Toulon, and their Dependencies; which Bond shall not be discharged but upon producing a Certificate, figned by the Commissioners aforefaid, or by some Person or Persons authorized for that Purpele by the faid Commiffioners, teftifying that the Condition of fuch Bond has been complied with ; or upon Proof being made. to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of the Cuftoms in England and Scotland respectively, that the faid Articles were taken by Enemies, or perifhed in the Sea.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and doth hereby order, that all Commodities, being of the Growth or Manufacture of the faid City and Port of Toulon, and their Dependencies, or of any other Part of France which shall be declared by His Majefty; or by Perfons duly authorized by His Majefty for that Purpole, to be under the Protection of His Majesty, (such Commodities being certified to be of the faid Growth or Manufacture, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be required and directed by any Perfon or Perfons who shall be duly authorized for that Purpose) shall be permitted to be imported into the Ports of this Kingdom, in British Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, fubject to the fame Rules, Regulations, Reftrictions, Duties, Penalties and Forfeitures, as Goods of the like Sort would have been fubject to, coming from France, immediately before the Commencement of the prefent War, according to Law, and according to the Treaty of Navigation and Commerce between Great Britain and France, figned at Verfailles the Twentyfixth Day of September, 1786, and the Convention figned on the Fifteeenth Day of January, 1787. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commisfioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. By Accounts from the Right Honorable Sir William Hamilton, Knight of the Bath, His Majefty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of Naples, dated the 17th of September, it appears, that on the 11th Captain Nelfon, in His Majefty's Ship Agamemnon, arrived there with Difpatches from Lord Hood, dated off Toulon the 27th of August, and a Letter, of the 31st, from Lord Hugh Conway, who had left Toulon in the Possession of Lord Hood, and met with Captain Nelfon at Sea; that Sir William Hamilton having communicated this Intelligence to General Acton, Two Thoufand of His Sicilian Majesty's best Troops were embarked on the 16th on board of Two Line of Battle Ships, Two Frigates, Two Corvettes, and One Neapolitan Transport Vessel. That a Spanish Frigate, returning to Toulon, had likewife taken fome of the Troops on board; that Three more Battalions were that Night to embark at Gaeta, on board of Two Neapolitan Frigates, Two Brigantines and Nine large Polacres. That, in a Week or Ten Days, the Neapolitan Government were to fend off to Toulon the remaining Ships, and Two Thousand more Men with Thirty Pieces of Regimental Artillery, and Plenty of Provisions; and that, should the Wind remain as it then was, those Succours might reach Toulon in Five Days, or sooner.
