Her Imperial Majesty dined on the Throne with the Imperial Family. Tables were foread in the fame Saloon for the Four First Classes, and decorated in a very beautiful Manner with Orange Trees, contrived to pass from underneath the Tables. In the Evening there was a Ball at Court, and the Festivities of the Day were concluded by very magnificent Illuminations.

Yesterday Morning the Nobility and Foreign Ministers had the Honor of complimenting Their Imperial Highnesses in their Apartments, and in the Evening there was a Ball at Court and Supper for the Four First Classes and the Foreign Ministers.
