PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to oblige Ships " more effectually to perform their Quarantine, * and for the better preventing the Plague being * brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain " or Ireland, or the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, " Alderney, Sark or Man," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That all Ships and Veffels arriving, and all Perfons, Goods and Merchandizes whatfoever, coming or imported into any Port or Place within Great Britain or Ireland, or any of the Isles beforementioned, from any. Place from whence His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, fhall judgeit probable that the Infection may be brought, shall be obliged to make their Quarantine in fuch Place and Places, for fuch Time, and in fuch Manner, as has been or shall, from Time to Time, be directed by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by His or Their Order or Orders, made in His or Their Privy Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandizes shall have respectively performed and be difcharged from fuch Quarantine, no fuch Perfon, Goods or Merchandizes, or any of them, shall come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on board any other Ship or Veffel,

in any Place within His Majefty's Dominions, unleis in fuch Mannre, and in fuch Cafes, and by fuch Licence, as shall be directed or permitted by fuch Order or Orders made by His Majefty, His Heirs or Successors, in Council as aforefaid; and that all fuch Ships and Vossels, and the Persons or Goods coming or imported in, or going or being put on board the fame, and all Ships, Veffels, Boats and Perfons receiving any Goods or Perfons ont of the fame, shall be subject to such Orders, Rules and Directions concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection, as have been or shall be made by His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, is Council, and notified by Proclamation or published in the London Gazette as aforementioned, under fuch Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by the faid Aft.

And whereas Information has been received that a malignant and contagious Fever, of the Nature of the Plague, has manifested itself at Philadelphia, in the State of Penfylvania, and in certain Towns of the State of New Jersey, in the United States of America; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth thereupon judge it expedient, for the Safety of the Public Health, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandize now a rived, or that shall hereafter arrive in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, from any of the Ports of the faid State of Penfylvania, or of the State of Delaware, or of the State of New Jerfey, in the United States of America, do make their Quarantine for Fourteen Days, which is to 62 commence and be computed from the Day each Ship or Veffel shall come to Anchor in the Place appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, and not before.

That the Places herein after named shall be and are hereby appointed to be the Places wherein fuch Ships or Veffels (not having the Infection on board) fhall respectively perform Quarantine; that is to fay : All fuch Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames or Medway, fhall perform their Quarantine in Standgate Creek ; all fuch Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Ipfwich, Yarmouth, Bofton, Hull, Newcaftle or Berwick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, shall perform their Quarantine in Whitebooth Road, between Hull and Grimíby; all fuch Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Carlifle and Chefter, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Isle of Man, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpool, at the Weft End thereof; all fuch Ships or Vessels which are or shail be bound to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Padflow or St. Ive's, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracombe or Barnstaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol or Bridgwater, or within the faid Members or Creeks, shall perform their Quarantine in Kingroad and Porfhute Pill; all fuch Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Port of Plymouth, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, and also except Falmouth, One Member thereof, or to the Port of Exeter, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned. or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks or other Places within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter and Pool, except as before excepted, shall .perform their Quarantine in some Place between Wood-End and Saltash, in the River Tamer ; all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or fhall be bound to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place called St. Ive's Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth ; and all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to the Ports of Southampton, Chichefter, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members. or Creeks thereof, or of any of them, or any other Place within the fame, shall perform their Quarantine at a Place called the Mother-Bank, hear Portf-

mouth; and all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to the Eastern Coast of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowstones, Aloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anftruther, Preston-Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montrofe and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, fhall perform their Quarantine in Inverkeithing Bay; and all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to the Weßern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbeltoun, Oban, Rothfay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Lamlash in the Island of Arran; and all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or fhall be bound to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Invernefs, Zetland, Orkney, Caithnefs and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Cromarty Bay in the Murray Firth 3 and all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to the South-West Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkuedbright, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Carsthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith ; and all fuch Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the las of Jerfey, or any Port thereof, fhail perform their Quarantine at a certain Place on the Coaft of the faid Ifland, called Belle Croute; or at fome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England; and all fuch Ships or Vessels as shall be bound to the Islands of Guernfey, Sack or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, or any of them, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place near the Island of Guernfey, called the Little Road, or at fome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England.

That no Pilot shall go on board any Ship or Vessel obliged to perform Quarantine, in order to conduct the fame into any Port or Place, but shall perform such Service in some other Boat or Vessel, which Boat or Vessel shall keep as much to the Windward of the Ship or Vessel so to be conducted as possible; and if any Pilot or other Perfor shall go on board such Ship or Vessel, such Pilot or other Perfon shall perform Quarantine, in like Manner as any Perfon coming in such Ship or Vessel shall be obliged to perform the fame.

That all Goods, Wares and Merchandizes liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, shall be opened, unpacked and aired, unless His Majesty shall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwife, and so remain a Week, other than Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk, raw, thrown or wrought, Linen, Cotton-Wool, Cotton-Yarn or manufactured, tured, Wool, raw or any wife wrought, Feathers, Grograin or Mohair Yarn, Human Hair, Goats Hair, Carmenia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Conton, Kid Skins, and Skins in the Wool or Hair, Spunges, Wine and Oil in Chefts, Thread Stockings, all Goods packed with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hats and Brufhés, Matting, and Artificial Flowers; which Goods and Merchandizes, fo as aforefaid enumerated, are to be opened, unpacked and aired, unlefs His Majefty fhall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwife, and fo remain for the Space of a Fortnight.

That all Goods imported by fuch Ships and Veffels respectively shall be aired in the following Places, that is to fay : All fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames, or Medway, shall be aired in Standgate Creek ; all fuch Goods as fhall be imported to the Ports of Ipfwich, Yarmouth, Bofton, Hull, New caftle, or Berwick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place sherein, shall be aired in Whitebooth Road, besween Hull and Grimfby; all fuch Goods as fhall be imported to the Ports of Carlifle and Cheffer. or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Ille of Man, shall be aired in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpool, at the Weft End thereof; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Briftol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Paditow, or St. Ive's, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracombe or Barnftaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Briftol or Bridgwater, or within the faid Members or Creeks, shall be aired in King's Road and Porshute-Pill; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Port of Plymouth, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, and also except Falmouth, one Member thereof, or to the Port of Exeter, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Poole; or any of the Members, or Creeks or other Places, within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter and Poole, except as before excepted, shall be aired at fome Place between Wood-End and Saltafh, in the River Tamer; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, . Mall be aired in a Place called St. Ive's Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth; all

fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Southampton, Chicheffer, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or any of them, or any other Place within the fame, shall be aired at a Place called the Motherbank, near Portsmouth: And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Eastern Coast of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowstoness, Alioa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anstruther, Preston-Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montrofe and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall be aired in Inverkeithing Bay; all such Goods as shall be imported to the Western Parts of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Cambeltonn, Oban, Rothfay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall be aired at Lamlash, in the Island of Arran'; and all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Invernets, Zetland, Orkney, Caithnels and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall be aired in Cromarty Bay, in the Murray Firth; and all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the South-Weil Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkuedbright, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall be carried to Carlthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith; and all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Isle of Jerley, or any Part thereof, shall be aired at a certain Place on the Coast of the faid Island, called Belle-Croute, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coast of England, where the Ships in which fuch Goods are imported shall respectively perform their Quarantine: And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Islands of Guernley, Sark or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, thall be aired in a Place near the Island of Guernfey, called the Little-Road, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England; where the Ships in which fuch Goods are imported fliall respectively perform their Quarantine.

That whatsoever Ship or Person shall receive any Men or Goods from on board any Ship or Vessel under Quarantine, shall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine.

That fuch Perfons as, after Quarantine performed, fhall be employed in the Hold of any Ship or Veffel for the taking any Goods not liable to retain Infection from the Goods and Merchandizes before enumerated, fhall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine.

That the Captains of every of His Majeffy's Ships of War, who shall meet any such Ship or Vessel coming to any of the Ports of Great Britain or Ireland, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, shall take due Care to prevent the Landing any Goods, Seamen or Passengers from on board the same, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majesty's Customs.

That the Commiffioners and other Officers of His Majefty's Cultoms do use their utmost Diligence and Care that the Quarantine before directed be duly performed.

That the Commissioners of His Majefty's Ships of War, as likewife the Commanders of His Majefty's Forts and Garrifons lying near the Sea Coafts, and all the Juffices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief Magistrates, Constables, Headboroughs, 'Tythingmen, and all other Officers and Ministers of Juffice, be aiding and affifting to the faid Officers of His Majefty's Customs, and to all others that shall be concerned in Ropping all such Ships as aforefaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of Jersey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
