PRESËNT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

7 HEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to oblige Ships " more effectually to perform their Quarantine, ss and for the better preventing the Plague being " brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain \*\* or Ireland, or the Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, " Alderney, Sark or Man," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That all Ships and Veffels arriving, and all Perfons, Goods and Merchandizes whatfoever, coming or imported into any Port or 'Place within Great Britain or Ireland, or any of the Isles beforementioned, from any Place from whence His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of Hisor Their Privy Council, shall judgeit probable that the Infection may be brought, shall be obliged to make their Quarantine in fuch Place and Places, for fuch Time, and in fuch Manner, as has been or shall, from Time to Time, be directed by His Majefly, His Heirs or Succeffors, by His or Their Order or Orders, made in His or Their Privy Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandizes shall have respectively per-

formed and be difcharged from fuch Quarantine, no fuch Perfons, Goods or Merchandizes, or any of them, shall come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on board any other Ship or Veffel, in any Place within His Majesty's Dominions, unless in fuch Manner, and in fuch Cafes, and by fuch Licence, as shall be directed or permitted by such Order or Orders made by His Majesty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels, and the Perfons or Goods coming or imported in, or going or being put on board the fame, and all Ships, Veffels, Boats and Perfons receiving any Goods or Perions ont of the fame, shall be subject to such Orders, Rules and Directions concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection, as have been or shall be made by His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, in Council, and notified by Proclamation or published in the London Gazette as aforementioned, under fuch Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by the faid Act.

And whereas Information has been received that a malignant and contagious Fever, of the Nature of the Plague, has manifefted itfelf at Philadelphia, in the State of Penfylvania, and in cortain Towns of the State of New Jerfey, in the United States of America; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth thereupon judge it expedient, for the Safety of the Public Health, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That all Ships, Veffels, Veffels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandize now arrived, or that fhall hereafter arrive in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, from any of the Ports of the faid State of Penfylvania, or of the State of Delaware, or of the State of New Jerfey, in the United States of America, do make their Quarantine for Fourteen Days, which is to commence and be computed from the Day each Ship or Veffel fhall come to Anchor in the Place appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, and not before.

That the Places herein after named shall be and are hereby appointed to be the Places wherein fuch Ships or Veffels (not having the Infection on board) shall respectively perform Quarantine; that is to fay : All fuch Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames or Medway, shall perform their Quarantine in Standgate Creek; all fuch Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Ipfwich, Yarmouth, Bofton, Hull, Newcaffle or Berwick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, shall perform their Quarantine in Whitebooth Road, between Hull and Grimiby; all fuch Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Carlifle and Chefter, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Isle of Man, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpool, at the Weit End thereof; all fuch Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Padflow or St. Ive's, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracombe or Barnstaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol or Bridgwater, or within the faid Members or Creeks, shall perform their Quarantine in Kingroad and Porfhute Pill; all fuch Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Port of Plymouth, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, and also except Falmouth, One Member thereof, or to the Port of Exeter, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks or other Places within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter and Pool, except as before excepted, shall perform their Quarantine in fome Place between Wood-End and Saltash, in the River Tamer ; all

fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, shall perform their Quaraptine in a Place called St. Ive's Pool, within the Month of the Harbour of Falmouth ; and all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to the Ports of Southampton, Chichefter, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or of any of them, or any other Place within the fame, shall perform their Quarantine at a Place called the Mother-Bank, near Portfmouth; and all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound; to the Eastern Coast of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowstonefs, Aloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anstruther, Preston-Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montrofe and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Inverkeithing Bay; and all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to the Western Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbeltoun, Oban, Rothfay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creck or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Lamlash in the Island of Arran; and all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or fhall be bound to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Invernels, Zetland, Orkney, Caithnefs and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Cromarty Bay in the Murray Firth; and all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to the South-Weft Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkcudbright, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Carsthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith ; and all fuch Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Isle of Jerley, or any Post thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at a certain Place on the Coast of the faid Island, called Belle Croute, or at fome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England; and all fuch Ships or Veffels as shall be bound to the Islands of Guernfey, Sark or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, or any of them, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place near the Island of Guernfey, called the Little Road, or at fome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England.

That no Pilot shall go on board any Ship or Veffel obliged to perform Quarantine, in order to conduct the same into any Port or Place, but shall perform such Service in some other Boat or Vessel, which which Boat or Veffel faal keep as much to the Windward of the Ship or Veffel fo to be conducted as poffible; and if any Pilot or other Perfon fhall go on board fuch Ship or Veffel, fuch Pilot or other Perfon fhall perform Quarantine, in like Manner as any Perfon coming in fuch Ship or Veffel fhall be obliged to perform the fame.

That all Goods, Wares and Merchandizes liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, shall be opened, unpacked and aired, unless His Majesty shall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwife, and fo remain a Week, other than Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk, raw, thrown or wrought, Linen, Cotton-Wool, Cotton-Yarn or manufactured, Wool, raw or any wife wrought, Feathers, Grograin or Mohair Yarn, Human Hair, Goats Hair, Carmenia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Kid-Skins, and Skins in the Wool or Hair, Spunges, Wine and Oil in Chefts, Thread Stockings, all Goods packed with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hats and Brushes, Matting, and Artificial Flowers; which Goods and Merchandizes, fo as aforefaid enumerated, are to be opened; unpacked and aired, unless His Majesty shall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwife, and fo remain for the Space of a Fortnight.

That all Goods imported by fuch Ships and Veffels respectively shall be aired in the following Places, that is to fay: All fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames, or Medway, shall be aired in Standgate Creek; all fuch Goods as fhall be imported to the Ports of Ipfwich, Yarmouth, Bofton, Hull, New caftle, or Berwick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, shall be aired in Whitebooth Road, between Hull and Grimfby; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Carlifle and Chefter, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Isle of Man, shall be aired in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpool, at the West End thereof; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Padítow, or St. Ive's, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracombe or Barnstaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Brittol or Bridgwater, or within the faid Mem-

bers or Creeks, shall be aired in King Road and Porshute-Pill; all such Goods as shall be imported to the Port of Plymouth, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, and also except Falmouth, one Member thereof, or to the Port of Exeter, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Poole, or any of the Members, or Creeks or other Places, within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter and Poole, except as before excepted, shall be aired at fome Place between Wood-End and Saltash, in the River Tamer; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth; or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, fhall be aired in a Place called St. Ive's Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Southampton, Chichefter, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or any of them, or any other Place within the fame, fhall be aired at a Place called the Motherbank, near Portsmouth: And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Eastern Coast of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowftonefs, Alloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anftruther; Preston-Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montrofe and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts there. of, shall be aired in Inverkeithing Bay; and all such Goods as shall be imported to the Western Parts of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Cambeltoun, Oban, Rothfay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall be aired at Lamlash, in the Island of Arran; and all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Invernefs, Zetland, Orkney, Caithnefs and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall be aired in Cromarty Bay, in the Murray Firth; and all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the South-Weft Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkcudbright, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall be aired at Carsthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith; and all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Isle of Jersey, or any Part thereof, shall be aired at a certain Place on the Coaft of the faid Island, called Belle-Croute, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coast of England, where the Ships in which fuch Goods are imported shall respectively perform their Quarantine : And all fuch Goods as shall be imimported

ported to the Islands of Guernfey, Sark or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, or any of them, shall be aired in a Place near the filand of Guernfey, called the Little-Road, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coast of England, where t e Ships in which fuch Goods are imported shall respectively perform their Quarantine.

That whatfoever Ship or Perfon shall receive any Men or Goods from on board any Ship or Vessel under Quarantine, shall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine.

That fuch Perfons as, after Quarantine performed, fhall be employed in the Hold of any Ship or Veffel for the taking any Goods not liable to retain Infection from the Goods and Merchandizes before enumerated, fhall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine.

That the Captains of every of His Majefly's Ships of War, who shall meet any such Ship or Vessel coming to any of the Ports of Great Britain or Ireland, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, shall take due Care to prevent the Landing any Goods, Seamen or Passengers from on board the fame, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majesty's Customs.

That the Commissioners and other Officers of His Majesty's Customs do use their utmost Diligence and Care that the Quarantine before directed be duly performed.

That the Commanders of His Majefty's Ships of War, as likewife the Commanders of His Majefty's Forts and Garrifons lying near the Sea Coafts, and all the Juftices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief Magistrates, Conftables, Headboroughs, Tythingmen, and all other Officers and Ministers of Juftice, be aiding and affifting to the faid Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms, and to all others that shall be concerned in stopping all such Ships as aforefaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of Jersey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

7 HEREAS it is highly important that fpecial Precautions should be taken to prevent any Kind of Corn, Meal or Flour, of which the Exportation from this Kingdom may be permitted, from falling into the Hands of the Enemy, and being made Use of for the Support and Sustemance of the Forces employed by Sea and Land against His Majesty or His Allies; His Majesty, having taken the fame into Confideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no Ship or Veffel, laden with any Sort of Corn, Meal or Flour, which shall be exportable purfuant to the Provisions of an Act, passed in the Thirty-first Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled, " An " Act for regulating the Importation and Exporta-" tion of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on " Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on " British Corn exported," and of an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament for amending the faid Act, shall be permitted to clear out from any Port of this Kingdom, until the Merchant Exporter of fuch Corn, Meal or Flour, thall have made Oath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which fuch Corn, Meal or Flour shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry shall be made, and shall allo, together with Two fufficient Sureties, of which the Mafter of fuch Ship or Veffel shall be One, have entered into Bond, in treble the Value of fuch Corn, Meal or Flour, with Condition to carry the fame to His Majefty's Kingdom of Ireland, or to the Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to fome Country, in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majefty, or to fome of His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to fome Fort or Garrifon belonging to or under the Protection of His Majefty, or to His Majefty's Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; and that fuch Ship or Veffel shall not depart from the Coaft, or proceed on her Voyage, without Convoy, and not defert fuch Convoy until fuch Ship or Veffel shall arrive at the Place of her Destination, or as long as fuch Convoy shall be instructed to protect the faid Ship or Veffel. And fuch Bond shall be difcharged by a Certificate, in like Manner as is directed with refpect to Bonds entered into for the due Exportation of Corn and other Articles exported on Bounty, in purfuance of the before mentioned Act, paffed

paffed in the Thirty-first Year of His prefent Majesty's ! Reign; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up but upon Production of fuch Certificate.

Provided always, that fuch Bond shall not be required with respect to any Ship or Vessel having on board no greater Quantity of any Corn, Meal or Flour, than shall be necessary to be carried in such Ship or Veffel on her Voyage, Out and Home, for the Suftenance, Diet, Support, and Ufe of the Commander, Malter, Mariners, Passengers and others, or of the Cattle, Live Stock, or other Animals on board of fuch Ship or Veffel.

Provided alfo, that fo much of the Condition of the faid Bond as relates to not departing without Convoy, or deferting fuch Convoy, shall not be required in the Cafe of fuch Ships or Veffels as shall clear out from some Port on the North-West Coast of this Kingdom; that is to fay, from the Firth of Clyde inclusive to the Port of Milford Haven inclusive, laden with Corn, Meal or Flour, for fome Port on the North and East Coast of the Kingdom of Ireland ; that is to fay, from the Port of Londonderry inclufive to the Port of Waterford inclusive.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively Sandy .... appertain.
