A Plantation called Simon, fituate in the Parish of St. An-A Plantation called Simon, fituate in the latin of St. An-drew, in the Quarter of Maiquis in the Ifland of Grenada, at almoft an equal Diffance from the Sea and the Mountains, about Three Miles in a direct Line from the Town and Har-bour of Grenville Bay, (where the Government have cfablifhed a Port and a Cuftom-Houfe for entering and clearing out Vef-feis, on which there is a Storehoufe belonging to the Planta-tion) fo that while it is free, on the one Hand, from the Expence and Inconveniency of a long laborious Cartage, it is, on the other, fecure of feafonable Weather, from it's Vicinity to the Mountains. The Rivers Simon and Cacoiere run through the Center of In Rivers Simon and Caconer run through the Center et it, which, in the drieft Seafons, will always furnifh Water more than fufficient to keep the Water-Work fully employed. The Soil is among the beft in the Island; the Scite moftly level, or gently declining; the Situation very healthy.
