#### Whitehall, December 3.

A Létter, of which the following is an Extract, was Yefterday received from Sir James Murray, Adjutant-General of the Forces under the Command of His Royal Highnefs the Duke of York, dated Tournai, November 29, 1793, by the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

THE Army remained in a State of Tranquillity until Yesterday, about Two o'Clock in the Afternoon, when the Enemy attacked Nechin and Leers, Two advanced Posts, occupied each by about 100 Men. They advanced in confiderable Force, particularly against Nechin, and made their Attack with great Rapidity. The Detachment posted there, which was a Picquet from the Grenadier Battalion of the Troops of Heffe Darmstadt, and Half a Company of the Imperial Free Corps of O'Donnell, defended the Post for some Time with great Gallantry, but being obliged to yield to the Superiority of Number, they retreated towards Bailleul, whilft the Detachment which occupied Leers, to avoid being furrounded, fell back to Effainbourg. Major General During, however, who had repaired upon the first Alarm to the Point of Attack, having brought up the Light Infantry Battalion of Heffe Darmstadt from Eftainbourg and Peck, and a Party of the Hanoverian Cavalry, under the Command of Colonel Linfingen, having advanced from Templeuve, the Enemy were driven back in their Turn; and the Pofts re-occupied.

The Darmstadt Troops had Two Men killed; Captain Von Shonberg and Seven Men wounded:

Captain Von Becker, who was likewife wounded; and Four Men taken. The Corps of O'Donnell had Six Men wounded and Two taken. The Hanoveriani Cavalry, One Man wounded. The Lofs of the Enemy was greater; feveral were found dead about the Village of Nechin, and Seven or Eight taken.
