Uppon the fuccefs of this Embafiy much will deperd, for the conjunction of the Crowh of "Poind in this War, would, befides thé affiftance we might teceive from it, extremely raife Pcoples fpirits here, who feem much dejected at the great fuccers of the Turkr, and the ill pofure our Army is at prefent in, which is very much weakned by a peltilentious diftemper that razes among the Soldiers, and takes away daily great numbers of them. Somedayes finceffreral Dutch. and other Officers of the Arafy being adazitted linto
the Czars prefénce, took that opportunity to cormi plais of General Rodanatski, whum they charged with feveral matters of that nature, that if they art proved, may not only coll that General his Employment, but likewife histife. The Czar has given Orders for the raifing the tenth Man throaghout alt his Dominions, by which means a valt Artmy will be formed, and a great many Perfons are employed to bury up a vall quantity of Arms and Ammu nition.
