HE Kings Most Excellent Majesty, (at the humble Request of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal in Parliament Affembled) Doth by this His Royal Proclamation Publish and Declare, That if any Perfont or Perfont field be-fore the Twenty fifth day of December next, make any further Difcovery of the late Horrid Defign against Hw Majelliss Sacred Perfon and Government, to one of His Majellies Principal Secretaries of State, He or they making (ich Discovery, shall not onely receive from His Maje by for every juck Discovery, the Reward of Two bundred Pounds, to be immediately paid upon due Proof of the Truth thereof; but if he or they mere a Princi-pal, or Principals in the faid Defign, or Guilty of the former Concoalment thereof, he or they shall have this Majesties Gracious Pardon for such his or their respective Offence.

Given at Our Court at Whitehall, the '7th day of November, 1678. in the Thirtie h year of Our Reign.

Moscow, Odob. 8. The Czar is fending two or three of the principal perfons of this Courtshis Ambaffadors to Poland, to be prefent at the General Dyct, which is appointed to be held the beginning of the next month; their main buline's is, to reprelent to the Poles the common danger both Nations arg in from the Turks, the progress their Arms have already made, by taking leveral important places, in the loss of which the Crown of *Poland* is almost equally concerned, feeing the Common Enemy doth thereby increase his firength and power, to annoy them, the refolutions that are taking here to employall the Force of the Czars Dominions in the carrying on of the War, and laftly to exhort the *Pales* to join in it with all their mights by doing of which they may reasonably hope to recover what they have been ferced of late years to yield to the Ottomans, &c. Upon the fuccels of this Embaliy much will depend, for the conjunction of the Crown of Poland in this War, would, befides the affiftance, we might receive from it, extremely raife Peoples spirits here, who feem much dejected at the great fuccess of the Turks, and the ill pollure out Army is at present in, which is very much weakned by a peftilentious diffemper that razes among the Soldiers, and takes away daily great numbers of them. Some dayes fince leveral Dutch. and other Officers of the Army being admitted intothe Czars prefence, took that opportunity to come plain of General Rodanatski, whom they charged with feveral matters of that nature, that if they are proved, may not only coll that General his Employ-ment, but likewife his Life. The Czar has given Orders for the raifing the tenth Man throughout all his Dominions, by which means a vaft Army will be formed, and a great many Persons are employed to buy up a vail quantity of Arms and Ammunițion.

Gripfwaldt, Nov. 18. Yefterday this City was furrendred to the Elector of Brandenburgh : The Articles were as follow.

1. The Governor and Garison shall march out of what Nation foever they be, according to the cuftom of War.

IÌ. That the natural born Succes, us well Soldiers, to those that were in any Givil Employment, shall be Convoyed to the Isle of Us dom, to be thence Trans ported, with the Garifon of Strachond, to Sueden ; but that the Germans, purfuant to the Emperors Avocatoria, Jhall remain here, or have Passes to go bonte.

ILT. All Officers, Civil and Military, and fuch persons as have fled bither, shall remain puffeffed of their Lands and Estates.

31 V. Such Goods as cannot be at prejent removed, may be bereafter, and Pages shall be given to that piet pofe.

V. The Wives of the several Officers, Cruit and Mi-Htary, and the Sick and Wounded, may remain here till Spring, under his Electoral Highneffes protection.

W1. All the Cannon and Ammanition to be deli-vered up to bis Elefforal Frighness, except two pieces, which the Governor shall take with him when he marches

out. VII. The Town and University to enjoy all their Priviledges.

Cottingsberg, Nov 22.
