WHEREAS by Articles of Capitulation, proposed by the Inhabitants of La Grande Anfe, including the Quarter at Jeremie, in the Island of St. Domingo in the West Indies, and accepted by Major-General Williamfon, His Majefty's Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Jamaica; and alfo by Articles of Capitulation, proposed by the Garrifon and Inhabitants of Cape Nicola Mole and it's Dependencies, in the faid Ifland of St. Domingo, and accepted by Commodore Ford, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Jamaica, Parts of the faid Ifland of St. Domingo have been furrendered to His Majesty, and are now in His Majesty's Poffeffion, and the Inhabitants thereof are become Subjects of His Majeity : And whereas by an Act paffed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act " more effectually to prevent, during the prefent "War between Great Britain and France, all " traiterous Correspondence with, or Aid or Affift-", ance being given to His Majesty's Enemies," all Perfons refiding or being in Great Britain are prohibited, under the Penalties of High Treafon, during the Continuance of the prefent War between Great Britain and France, from fupplying, to or for the Ufe of any Perfon or Perfons refiding or being within any of the Dominions of France, or any Town, Territory, Port or Place annexed to France, or under the Government of the Perfons then exercifing, or who might-thereafter, during the faid War, ex-

ercife the Powers of Government in France, divers Articles specified in the faid Act, without Licence from His Majesty, under His Sign Manual, or by Order in Council, or by Proclamation, first had and and obtained, specifying the Articles with respect to which the fame fhall be had and obtained, and alfo the Place and Places from which and to which the fame shall be sent : His Majesty, taking the Premisses into His Royal Confideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that it shall be lawful to and for all Perfons refiding or being in Great Britain to fell, fupply and deliver from any Port or Place in Great Britain, or any Part of His Majesty's Dominions, in or out of Europe, or in any Country ia Amity with His Majefty, to fuch Parts of the faid Island of St. Domingo as are or shall be in His Majefly's Poffeffion, any of the Articles specified and enumerated in the before mentioned Act, fubject neverthelefs to fuch Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, Reftrictions, Penalties and Forfeitures, as the Trade in the faid feveral Articles to any of His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations is or shall be liable to by Law : But it is His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend to authorize the Exportation from Great Britain, or from any other of His Majesty's Dominions in or out of Europe, of any of the Articles aforefaid, which are or fhall be prohibited to be exported otherwife than by the faid Act.

And His Majesty is pleased further to order and declare, and it is hereby further ordered and declared, that all His loving Subjects may lawfully trade to and

and from fuch Parts of the faid Ifland of St. Do-] mingo as are or shall be in His Majesty's Possession, Cibject neverthelefs to the fame Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, Restrictions, Penalties and Forfeitures, to which the Trade to and from His Majefty's Colonies, Plantations and Islands in the Weft Indies is or shall be fubject by Law: But it is His Majefly's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained thall extend to prevent the Importation in American Bottoms of Provisions, Cattle, Grain and Wood of every Kind from the United States of America into fuch Parts of the faid Island as aforefaid, fo long as the fame shall be allowed, in purfuance of and under the Terms and Conditions of the faid Articles of Capitulation, or any other Privileges or Exemptions granted by the faid Articles of Capitulation.

And His Majefty is further pleafed to order and acclare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, That all Commodities, being of the Growth, Produce or Manufacture of fuch Parts of the faid Ifland of St. Domingo as fhall, at the Time of the Entry of fuch Commodities for Exportation from the faid Ifland, be in the Poffeffion of His Majefty, fhall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of this Kingdom in Britifh Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, fubject to the fame Duties, Rules, Regulations, Reftrictions, Conditions, Penalties and Forfeitures, as Articles of the like Sort are fubject to, coming from His Majefty's Colonies, Plantations or Iflands in the Weft Indies.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. **7HEREAS** His Majefly was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the

Scrvice of the Royal Navy : And whereas His Majefty was also gracioufly pleafed, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February last, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majefty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this Inftant December: And it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this instant December to the Twenty-eighth Day of February 1794, inclusive: Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice. and govern themfelves accordingly.

" exported," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majefty, His Heirs and Successors, and He and They is and are thereby authorized, with Advice of His or Their Privy Council, at any Time when the General Average

rage Price of any Sort of Com or of Oatmeal, in that Part of Great Britain called England, and to England or Scotland respectively, taken as in the faid Act paffed in the laft Selfion of Parliament is directed, shall appear to be at or above the Price at or above which Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour of the fame Sort is allowed by Law to be imported from Ireland or the Province of Quebec, or the other Britifh Colonies and Plantations in North America, at the first Low Duties specified in the Table marked E. in the faid Act paffed in the Thirty-first Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, to prohibit generally, for a limited Time, the Exportation from England and Scotland respectively, as the Cafe may be, of any fuch Sort of Corn or other Articles mentioned in the faid Acts; and in like Manner, at any Time when the Average Price of any Sort of Corn or of Oatmeal, in England or Scotland refpectively, taken as in the faid Act passed in the last Session of Parliament is directed, shall appear to be at or above the Price at or above which Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour of the fame Sort is allowed by Law to be imported from any other Foreign Country at the first Low Duty fpecified in the faid Table marked E. to permit generally the Importation into England or Scotland respectively, as the Cafe may be, or the taking out of Warehouse for Home Consumption, of any fuch Sort of Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only, and no other ; and in the like Manner to recall fuch Prohibition of Permission, if Circumstances shall appear so to require : Provided always, that as often as the Importation of any Sort of Corn, Meal or Flour, on the Low Duties, shall be permitted by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, fuch Permiffion shall continue in Force for the Space of Three Months at least from the Date of the Order in Council made for that Purpole. And whereas, in purfuance of the Powers vefted in His Majefty by the faid Act, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, was pleafed, by His Order in Council bearing Date the 28th of August last, to prohibit (under the Provisions, Regulations and Exceptions therein menioned and referred to) until the 30th of November, then enfuing, the Exportation from any of the Ports of that Part of Great Britain called England of any Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Bilcuit made thereof; and in like Manner to prohibit the Expor-- tation from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland of any Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Bread or Bifcuit made thercof; and alfo to declare and order, that from and after the Date of the faid Order, until the Thirtieth Day of November then enfuing, it should be lawful to import into any Port or Place in

take out of Warehoufe for Home Confumption, any Foreign Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats, or Oatmeal ; and alfo to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and to take out of Warehoufe, for Home Confumption, any Foreign Barley, Peafe, Oats and Oatmeal, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only; mentioned in the faid Table marked E. and no other. And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Week ending the Sixteenth Day of November, 1793, that the General Average Prices of Rye; Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, in that Part of Great Britain called England, are above the Prices at which Foreign Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty specified in the faid Table marked E.; His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, purfuant to the Powers given by the faid Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition to export Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Oats, or any Mcal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Bifcuit made thereof, from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and every Provision respecting the faid Prohibition in the faid Order mentioned and referred to, shall be and continue in Force until the Fourth Day of March, 1794. And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Month immediately preceding the Fifteenth Day of October, 1793, that the General Average Price of Peafe, Beans, Oats and Oatmeal, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, are above the Prices at which Foreign Peafe, Beans, Oats and Oatmeal, are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty specified in the faid Table marked E.; His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, purfuant to the Powers given by the faid Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition to export Peafe, Beans or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Bifcuit made thereof, from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and every Provision, Regulation and Exception respecting the faid Prohibition in the faid Order mentioned and referred to, shall be and continue in Force until the Fourth Day of March, 1794. And His Majefty, by and with the Advice aforefaid, hath thought fit further to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Permiffion to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and to take out of Waréhoufe, for Home Confumption, any Foreign Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats or Qatmeal; and that the Permission to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and to take out of Warehouse; for Home Confumption

Confumption, any Foreign Peafe, Oats and Oatmeal, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only, mentioned in the faid Table marked E, and no other, in the faid Order contained, shall be and continue in Force until the Fourth Day of March, 1794; and that it shall be lawful in like Manner to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and to take out of Warehouse for Home Consumption, any Foreign Beans, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only, mentioned in the faid Table marked E. and no other.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly.

Manheim, December 2.

On the 29th Ult. the French Troops, to the Number of 30,000 Men, attacked the Duke of Brunswick in the Retrenchments of Landau, but were repulled with great Lofs. A fecond Attack was made by them on the 30th, when they were again compelled to re-treat; and the Duke of Brunfwick having learnt, the following Day, that a Body of the French was again formed at Rainstein, His Serene Highnels immediately marched to attack them, and fucceeded in driving them beyond Hombourg, after taking from them their Baggage, Artillery and Ammunition. On the fame Day a general Attack was made on the whole Line of General Wurmfer's Army, and, after an Engagement which lasted the whole Day, the French were driven beyond Strafbourg.

Brussels, December 10.

The Particulars of the frequent Actions which General Wurmfer and the Duke of Bruniwick had with the French Army on the 29th and 30th of November, and the 1st and 2d of December, have not yet been received here, further than that the French were repulfed with confiderable Lofs-on those feveral The Number of French killed, wounded and Days. taken Prifoners, according to the best Accounts, appearing not to be lefs than 15,000 Men.
