Europe, of any of the Articles aforefaid, which are or shall be prohibited to be exported otherwife than by the faid Act.

And His Majefty is pleafed further to order and declare, and it is hereby further ordered and declared, that all His loving Subjects may lawfully trade to and from fuch Parts of the faid Island of St. Domingo as are or shall be in His Majesty's Possession, fubject nevertheless to the same Duries, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, Reffrictions, Penalties and Forfeitures, to which the Trade to and from His Majefty's Colonies, Plantations and Itlands in the Weft Indies is or fhall be fubject by Law: But it is His Majefly's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend to prevent the Importation in American Bottoms of Provisions, Cattle, Grain and Wood of every Kind from the United States of America into fuch Parts of the faid Island as aforefaid, fo long as the fame shall be allowed, in pursuance of and under the Terms and Conditions of the faid Articles of Capitulation, or any other Privileges or Exemptions granted by the faid Articles of Capitulation.

And His Majefty is further pleafed to order and aeclare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, That all Commodities, being of the Growth, Produce or Manufacture of fuch Parts of the faid Ifland of St. Domingo as shall, at the Time of the Entry of fuch Commodities for Exportation from the faid Island, be in the Posses for His Majesty, shall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of this Kingdom in British Ships, owned by His Mazjesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, subject to the fame Duties, Rules, Regulations, Refirictions, Conditions, Penalties and Forfeitures, as Articles of the like Sort are subject to, coming from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations or Islands in the West Indies.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majetty's Treasury and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

P R E S E N T, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W Pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the

Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majetty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February last, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this Instant December: And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this instant. December to the Twenty-eighth Day of February 1794, inclusive : Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
