

and from such Parts of the said Island of St. Domingo as are or shall be in His Majesty's Possession, subject nevertheless to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, Restrictions, Penalties and Forfeitures, to which the Trade to and from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations and Islands in the West Indies is or shall be subject by Law: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend to prevent the Importation in American Bottoms of Provisions, Cattle, Grain and Wood of every Kind from the United States of America into such Parts of the said Island as aforesaid, so long as the same shall be allowed, in pursuance of and under the Terms and Conditions of the said Articles of Capitulation, or any other Privileges or Exemptions granted by the said Articles of Capitulation.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, That all Commodities, being of the Growth, Produce or Manufacture of such Parts of the said Island of St. Domingo as shall, at the Time of the Entry of such Commodities for Exportation from the said Island, be in the Possession of His Majesty, shall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of this Kingdom in British Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Conditions, Penalties and Forfeitures, as Articles of the like Sort are subject to, coming from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations or Islands in the West Indies.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, threatening incendiary Letters, of which the following are Copies, were, in the Night of the 21st of November last, laid at the Entrance of the Court Yards of Three of the principal Farmers, in Northiam in Suffex, which Letters appear to be all of the same Person's Hand-Writing, and that similar Letters have also been dispersed and laid at the Thresholds of other Persons in Northiam, viz.

1793. Septbr 14. Gentlemen all ie hope you whill take this as a Wharning to you for you to put the little measher bie and take the Oald Measher again for if you dont ie whill set all your Cornestacks a fier and your Corne houses and burne them all up and you along with it, little measher and all Ie will burne you all together in the Nite when you are a bead and a sleep soe I hope you whill put the little measher bie and take the oald measher againe for if you dont I whill be as god as my Whord for it shall be Soe in all placeses as whell as Northiam but Northiam meashures shall goe fist and then all parishea shall go nixt.
