. Whitehall, January 4.

As several Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign-Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the fllow-ing Assiroits of Acts of Parliament of Their late Moresits King George the Fiest and Second and of His present. Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties, they may incur by Dischedience to them: And it will be observed, that Juch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artisicers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

F any Person shall contract with, enrice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Atificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Person having been once convicted shall offend again he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said. Trades to Fereigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercising any of the said Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artisicers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Persons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavour ing to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majelty's Dominions, for the Purpoles afore faid, such Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before fome other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions: And, if fuch Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any such Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give such Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the same shall be prosecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavou to seduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or othe Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, o any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indicament in the Court of Justiciary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Benchat Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireland; the Person so convided shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or seduced, forseit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisomment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in Case of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again of ending shall forfeit, for every Perion contracted with of feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein such Ossender shall be convicted, for Two Years, 22d until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any such Tools or Utensils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of such Tools, he shall, for every Offence, sorfeit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Assign of Debt, &c. in any Court

of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and secure, in some of His Macily's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils probibited to be exported, as such Officer shall sind on Board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools so seized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly sold to the best Bidder; and one Moiery of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall seize and secure the same.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the said Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vessel, he shall, for every such Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inslicted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and, if the Vessel belongs to His Majesty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Empoyment, and be incapable of any Employment

under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fusfer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Susferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the said Tools, or knowingly suffer the same to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED FOUNDS, to be recovered as aforesaid, and also forteit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Mojesty.

One Moiety of the Forscitures shall be applied to the Use of the Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same,

Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His present

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forseitures as above mentioned are extended to
Persons packing or putting on board any Vessel,
not bound directly for some Port in Great Britain
or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Press,
Paper, Utensil or Implement whatsoever, used in
or proper for the working or finithing of the Cotton, Linen, Steel or Iron Manusactures of this
Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of such Machines
or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof;
and all Captains of Ships and other Persons receiving or being in Possession of any such Articles,
with an Intent to export the same to Foreign
Parts, and all Custom-heuse Officers suffering an
Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable
to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in
the Case of Tools and Utensils used in the Woollen
and Silk Manusauses.

The King of Great Britain having been graciously pleased to nominate Charles Whitworth, Esq; His Envoy Extraordinary and Minster Plenipotentiary at this Court, to be a Knight Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, and His Majesty being desirons that he should be knighted, and invested with the Enfigns of the faid Order in the most honorable and most distinguished Manner, My. Whitworth applied to Her Imperial Majesty the Empress of Russia, by Order of the King his Master, to desire she would be pleased to represent His Majesty on this Occasion: To which Her Imperial Majesty very readily consented, expressing in the strongest Terms her Sentiments of Friendship and Affection towards His British 1988. manick Majesty, and was at the same Time pleased to appoint Sunday the 17th, immediately after Divine Service, for the Performance of the Cere-

mony, which was as follows:

Mr. Whitworth having at Noon repaired to the Palace, according to Appointment, he was there received by the Grand Matter of the Ceremonies, who conducted him into the Audience Room, where Her Imperial Majesty was attended by Count Osterman, the Vice Chancellor; the Great Duke and Duchess, and all the Principal Officers of the Court, being in an adjacent Apartment, with the Folding Doors open. Mr. Whitworth, being introduced by the Grand Master of the Coremonies, made a low Reverence on his Entrance, a fecond in the Middle of the Room, and a third on his approaching Her Imperial Majesty: And Mr. Whitworth then kneeling, Her Imperial Majesty immediately invested him with the Ribbon and Badge of the Order; and then taking from a Table a Gold-hilted Sword, richly ornamented with Diamonds, the Empress touched his Lest Shoulder Three Times with it, pronouncing these Words: Soyez Bon et Honorable Chevalier, au Nom de Dien; and on Sir Charles Whitworth's riling up, and killing Her Imperial Majetty's Hand, the Empress added, Et pour vous prouver combien je suis contente de vous, je vous fais Prejent de l'Épée avec laquelle je vous ai fait Chevalier. 'Thea Sir Charles, after expressing to Her Imperial Majetty his respectful and grateful Sense of thele mote gracious and extraordinary Marks of Envor, withdrew from the Empress's Presence, observing the same Coremonies as at his Entrance.
