As feweral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave, from Time to Time, gone into Forsign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the filow-ing Affracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Maje its King George the First and Second and of His prefent. Majefly, for preventing fuch Practices, are putlished, for the Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties, they may incur by Difchedience to them : And it will be objerved, that Juch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or infrumental in the Sending

or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of thefe Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Infruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers ibemfelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27. F any Perfon fuall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Attificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Atificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Weftminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again. he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid. Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from, henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfons, shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.
