

E, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the just and necessary War in which We are engaged with France, and putting Our Trust in Almighty God that He will gracioufly blefs Our Arms, both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, that a Publick Fast and Humiliation be oblerved throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, on Friday the Twenty-eighth Day of February next; that fo both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins; and may, in the most devout and folemn Manner, fend up our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majefty, for averting those heavy Judgements which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deferved.; and imploring His Bleffing and Affiltance on Our Arms, and for reftoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety, and Profperity to Us and Our Kingdoms : And We do firiely charge and command, that the faid Publick Faft be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect

the Performance of fo religious and neceffary a Duty: And for the better and more orderly folemnizing the fame, We have given Directions to the Molt Reverend the Archbishops and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England to compose a Form of Prayer fuitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of Publick Worship; and to take Care the fame be timely dispersed throughout their respective Dioces.

E, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the just and neceffary War in which We are engaged with France, and putting Our Trust in Almighty God that He will graciously blefs Our Arms, both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, that a Publick Fast and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, on Thursday the Twenty-feventh Day of February next; that so both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins; and may, in the most devout and folemn Manner, "ond up Our Preyers and Supplications to the Divine I Majefty, for avorting those heavy Judgements which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deferved, and imploring His Bleffing and Affiliance on Our Arms, and for reftoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety, and Profperity to Us and Our Kingdoms : And We do firifly charge and command, that the faid Publick Fait be revotently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, as sthey tender the Favour of Almignty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of fuch Panishment as We may justly inflict on all fuch as contemn and negled the Performance of fo religious and necessary a Duty. Our Will is therefore, and We charge, that this Our Proclamation feen, ye forthwith pass to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance : And Our Will and Pleasure is, that Our Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published; and We appoint them to fend Copies hereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the fame may be published, and read from the Pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.

7HEREAS John Jones, of Woodside in the Township of Ashton, in the Parish of Tarvin in the County of Chefter, Yeoman, was, upon the Ninth Day of December, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-three, charged by Information, upon the Oaths of credible Perfons, by them fubfcribed, before the Reverend Peploe Ward, of the City of Chefter, Clerk, George William Prefcott, of the Abbey Square, in the fame City, Efquire, Charles Henchman, of the fame City, Efquire, and Richard Richardson, of Capenhurst in the County of Chefter, Efquire, Four of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the faid County, with having, on the First Day of October, in the faid Year of our Lord, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-three, at Woodfide aforefaid, in the Township aforefaid, and Parish

and County aforefaid, wilfully and malicioully, with loaded Guns and Pistols, shot at and wounded Samuel Thomas, of the City of Chetter aforefaid, Sheriff's Officer, and alto Daniel Whitheld, of the fame City, Labourer, and also Robert Foulkes, of the fame City, Labourer, fuch feveral Perfons then and there being in the Township of Ashton aforefaid, in the Parish and County aforefaid ; which information was afterwards certified by the faid Justices of the Peace, to One of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, who has laid the fame before His Majelly in His Privy Council, purfuant to the Act of Parliament of the Ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King George the First, in that Cafe made and provided : His Majefty doth, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by this His Order in His Privy Council, require and command, that the faid John Jones do and shall surrender himself, within the Space of Forty Days, to One of the Justices of His Majesty's Court of King's Bench, or to One of His Majefly's Juffices of the Peace, to the End that he may be forthcoming to answer the faid Offence and Offences wherewith he stands charged by the faid Information, according to due Courfe of Law. And His Majefly is pleafed further to order, as it is hereby ordered, that this Order shall be printed and published in the next London Gazette, and shall be forthwith transmitted to the Sheriff of the faid County of Chefter; and that the faid Sheriff shall, within Six Days after the Receipt thereof, by himfelf or his Officers, proclaim the fame Order, between the Hours of Ten in the Morning and Two in the Afternoon, in the Market Places, upon the respective Market Days, of Two Market Towns in the faid County of Cheffer, near, the Place where fuch Offence and Offences wero committed, and shall cause a true Copy of this Order to be affixed upon fome public Place in each of fuch Market Towns, according to the true Intent and Meaning of the faid Act, in fuch Cafe made and provided.
