T/E, taking into Our most serious Consideration the just and necessary War in which We are engaged with France, and putting Our Trust in Almighty God that He will graciously blek Our Arms, both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, that a Publick Fast and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, on Friday the Twenty-eighth Day of February next; that so both We and Our People may humble Ourselves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins; and may, in the most devout and solemn Manner, fend up our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgements which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deserved; and imploring His Blesfing and Assistance on Our Arms, and for restoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety, and Prosperity to Us and Our Kingdoms: And We do firically charge and command, that the faid Publick Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Runishment as We may justly inslict on all such as conteins and neglect

the Performance of so religious and necessary a Duty. And for the better and more orderly solemnizing the same, We have given Directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England to compose a Form of Prayer suitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of Publick Worship; and to take Care the same be timely dispersed throughout their respective Dioceses.

fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine ! Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgements which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deserved, and imploring His Blessing and Assistance on Our Arms, and for restoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety, and Prosperity to Us and Our Kingtloms: And We do strictly charge and command, that the faid Publick Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly instict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of so religious and necessary a Duty. Our Will is therefore, and We charge, that this Our Proclamation feen, ye forthwith pass to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance: And Our Will and Pleasure is, that Our Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the several Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to see the same published; and We appoint them to send Copies hereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the same may be published, and read from the Pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.

WHEREAS John Jones, of Woodfide in the Township of Ashton, in the Parish of Tarvin In the County of Chefter, Yeoman, was, upon the Ninth Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-three, charged by Information, upon the Oaths of credible Persons, by them subscribed, before the Reverend Peploe Ward, of the City of Chester, Clerk, George William Prescott, of the Abbey Square, in the same City, Esquire, Charles Henchman, of the fame City, Esquire, and Richard Richardson, of Capenhurst in the County of Chester, Esquire, Four of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the faid County, with having, on the First Day of October, in the faid Year of our Lord, One thousand seven hundred and ninety three, at Woodade aforefaid, in the Township aforesaid, and Parish

and County aforefaid, wilfully and maliciously, with loaded Guns and Pittols, shot at and wounded Samuel Thomas, of the City of Chester aforesaid, Sheriff's. Officer, and also Daniel Whitfield, of the same City, Labourer, and also Robert Foulkes, of the same City, Labourer, fuch feveral Persons then and there being in the Township of Ashton aforesaid, in the Parith and County aforefaid; which Information was afterwards certified by the faid Justices of the Peace, to One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, who has laid the fame before His Majesty in His Privy Council, pursuant to the Act of Parliament of the Ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majetty King George the First, in that Case made and provided: His Majefty doth, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by this His Order in His Privy Council, require and command, that the faid John Jones do and shall surrender himself, within the Space of Forty Days, to One of the Justices of His Majesty's Court of King's Bench, or to One of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, to the End that he may be forthcoming to answer the faid Offence and Offences wherewith he stands charged by the said Information, according to due Course of Law. And His Majesty is pleased further to order, as it is hereby ordered, that this Order shall be printed and published in the next London Gazette, and shall be forthwith transmitted to the Sheriff of the faid County of Chefter; and that the faid Sheriff shall, within Six Days after the Receipt thereof, by himfelf or his Officers, proclaim the same Order, between the Hours of Ten in the Morning and Two in the Afternoon, in the Market Places, upon the respective Market Days, of Two Market Towns in the faid County of Chester, near the Place where such Offence and Offences were committed, and shall cause a true Copy of this Order to be affixed upon some public Place in each of such Market Towns, according to the true Intent and Meaning of the faid Act, in such Case made and provided. WHEREAS by Order in Council, bearing Date the Ninth Day of October last, His Majesty was pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order and declare, that from and after the Date of the said Order, until His Majesty's Pleasure should be signified to the contrary, all His loving Subjects might lawfully trade to and with the City and Port of Toulon, and the Dependencies thereof, under certain Exceptions, Regulations, Conditions, Restrictions, Duties, Penalties and Forseitures, specified in the

faid Order; and further to order and declare as in the same Order is expressed: And whereas the faid City and Port of Toulon, and the Dependencies thereof, are no longer under the Protection of His Majesty, but are under the Government of the Perfons exercifing the Powers of Governmeut in France: It is this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the said Order in Council, and every Part thereof, be, and the same is hereby, from the Day of the Date of this prefent Order in Council, vacated and repealed. It is, nevertheless, His Majerly's Will and Pleasure, that the faid Order shall continue in full Force and Effect as to all Commodities permitted by the faid Order to be imported from the faid City and Port of Toulon, and their Dependencies, into the Ports of this Kingdom, in the Manner mentioned in the said Order, which shall be proved, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cultoms, or to fuch Persons as they shall appoint, to have been actually shipped for such Importation during the Time that the faid Port was under the Protection of His Majesty. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commillioners of His Ma jelly's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twentyty-fourth of July, 1793, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar Iron, Lemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twentyfifth Day of this instant January; and whereas it is judged expedient for His Majetty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition Thousd be consinued for fome Time longer: His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twenty fifth Day of this instant January, presume to trasport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores; or ship or lade any of the Articles above

mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Fo:feitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the last Session of of Parliament, intituled, " An Act to enable His " Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval " Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt Petre, Arms and Ammunition, " when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council." But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels. or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of fuch Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa; or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purpoles of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Co. ft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Flaces for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purpoles specified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
