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*Westminster, January 21, 1794.*

**T**HIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to make the following most gracious Speech:

*My Lords, and Gentlemen,*

**T**HE Circumstances under which you are now assembled require your most serious Attention.

We are engaged in a Contest, on the Issue of which depend the Maintenance of Our Constitution, Laws, and Religion, and the Security of all Civil Society.

You must have observed, with Satisfaction, the Advantages which have been obtained by the Arms of the Allied Powers, and the Change which has taken Place in the general Situation of Europe, since the Commencement of the War. The United Provinces have been protected from Invasion. The Austrian Netherlands have been recovered and maintained; and Places of considerable Importance have been acquired on the Frontiers of France. The Recapture of Mentz, and the subsequent Successes of the Allied Armies on the Rhine, have, notwithstanding the Advantages recently obtained by the Enemy in that Quarter, proved highly beneficial to the Common Cause. Powerful Efforts have been made by My Allies in the South of Europe. The temporary Possession of the Town and Port of Toulon has greatly distressed the Operations

of My Enemies; and in the Evacuation of that Place an important and decisive Blow has been given to their Naval Power, by the distinguished Conduct, Abilities, and Spirit of My Commanders, Officers and Forces, both by Sea and Land.

The French have been driven from their Possessions and Fishery at Newfoundland; and important and valuable Acquisitions have been made both in the East and West Indies.

At Sea our Superiority has been undisputed, and our Commerce so effectually protected, that the Losses sustained have been inconsiderable in Proportion to its Extent, and to the Captures made on the contracted Trade of the Enemy.

The Circumstances by which the further Progress of the Allies has hitherto been impeded, not only prove the Necessity of Vigour and Perseverance on Our Part, but at the same Time confirm the Expectation of ultimate Success. Our Enemies have derived the Means of temporary Exertion, from a System which has enabled them to dispose arbitrarily of the Lives and Property of a numerous People, and which openly violates every Restraint of Justice, Humanity and Religion. But these Efforts, productive as they necessarily have been of internal Discontent and Confusion, have also tended rapidly to exhaust the national and real Strength of that Country.

Although I cannot but regret the necessary Continuance of the War, I should ill consult the essential Interests of My People if I were desirous of Peace, on any Grounds but such as may provide for their

permanent

permanent Safety, and for the Independence and Security of Europe. The Attainment of these Ends is still obstructed by the Prevalence of a System in France, equally incompatible with the Happiness of that Country, and with the Tranquillity of all other Nations.

Under this Impression I thought proper to make a Declaration of the Views and Principles by which I am guided. I have ordered a Copy of this Declaration to be laid before you, together with Copies of several Conventions and Treaties with different Powers, by which you will perceive how large a Part of Europe is united in a Cause of such general Concern.

I reflect, with unspeakable Satisfaction, on the steady Loyalty and firm Attachment to the established Constitution and Government, which, notwithstanding the continued Efforts employed to mislead and to seduce, have been so generally prevalent among all Ranks of My People. These Sentiments have been eminently manifested in the Zeal and Alacrity of the Militia to provide for Our internal Defence, and in the distinguished Bravery and Spirit displayed on every Occasion by My Forces, both by Sea and Land: They have maintained the Lustre of the British Name, and have shewn themselves worthy of the Blessings which it is the Object of all Our Exertions to preserve.

*Gentlemen of the House of Commons,*

I have ordered the necessary Estimates and Accounts to be laid before you; and I am persuaded you will be ready to make such Provision as the Exigencies of the Time may require. I feel too sensibly the repeated Proofs which I have received of the Affection of My Subjects not to lament the Necessity of any additional Burthens. It is, however, a great Consolation to Me to observe the favourable State of the Revenue, and compleat Success of the Measure, which was last Year adopted, for removing the Embarrassments affecting Commercial Credit.

Great as must be the Extent of our Exertions, I trust you will be enabled to provide for them in such a Manner as to avoid any Pressure which could be severely felt by My People.

*My Lords, and Gentlemen,*

In all your Deliberations you will undoubtedly bear in Mind the true Grounds and Origin of the War.

An Attack was made on Us and on Our Allies, founded on Principles which tend to destroy all Property, to subvert the Laws and Religion of every civilized Nation, and to introduce universally that wild and destructive System of Rapine, Anarchy, and Impiety, the Effects of which, as they have already been manifested in France, furnish a dreadful

but useful Lesson to the present Age and to Posterity.

It only remains for Us to continue to persevere in Our united Exertions: Their Discontinuance or Relaxation could hardly procure even a short Interval of delusive Repose, and could never terminate in Security or Peace. Impressed with the Necessity of defending all that is most dear to Us, and relying, as We may with Confidence, on the Valour and Resources of the Nation, on the combined Efforts of so large a Part of Europe, and, above all, on the incontestable Justice of Our Cause, let Us render Our Conduct a Contrast to that of Our Enemies, and, by cultivating and practising the Principles of Humanity and the Duties of Religion, endeavour to merit the Continuance of the Divine Favor and Protection, which have been so eminently experienced by these Kingdoms.

WHEREAS by Order in Council, bearing Date the Ninth Day of October last, His Majesty was pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order and declare, that from and after the Date of the said Order, until His Majesty's Pleasure should be signified to the contrary, all His loving Subjects might lawfully trade to and with the City and Port of Toulon, and the Dependencies thereof, under certain Exceptions, Regulations, Conditions, Restrictions, Duties, Penalties and Forfeitures, specified in the said Order; and further to order and declare as in the same Order is expressed: And whereas the said City and Port of Toulon, and the Dependencies thereof, are no longer under the Protection of His Majesty, but are under the Government of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France: It is this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the said Order in Council, and every Part thereof, be, and the same is hereby, from the Day of the Date of this present Order in Council, vacated and repealed. It is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Will and Pleasure, that the said Order shall continue in full Force and Effect as to all Commodities permitted by the said Order to be imported from the said City and Port of Toulon, and their Dependencies, into the Ports of this Kingdom, in the Manner mentioned in the said Order, which shall be proved, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, or to such Persons as they shall appoint, to have been actually shipped for such Importation during

during the Time that the said Port was under the Protection of His Majesty. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fourth of July, 1793, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant January; and whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer: His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Twenty-fifth Day of this instant January, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores; or ship or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms and Ammunition; when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council." But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of

such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa; or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles, for the Purposes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
