Accounts have been received here from the Head Quarters at Bollou, dated December 23, that at Day-Break on the 21st the Africa attacked and carried all the Enemy's Advanced Lines and Batteries; which Success, together with the Capture of Port Vendre, Fort St. Telmo, and Collioure, determined the Enemy, whose Lest and Rear Flanks were laid open, to quit, in the Course of that Night, all their Camps and Posts in Front of the Allies, and retire into Perpignan, leaving the Spaniards Masters of the Country to the very Gates of the Town.
