That in consequence thereof the Petitioner, Lord Hood, delivered in a Statement as follows: "The Petitioner, Lord Hood, states the Right of Election for the City and Liberty of Westminster is in the Inhabitants Householders, paying Scot and Lot, within the united Parishes of St. Margaret and St. John, and the several Parishes of St. Paul Covent Garden, St. Ann, St. James, St. George Hanover-square, and the Liberty of St. Martin le Grand in the County of Middlesex, and in so much of the Parishes of St. Martin in the Fields, St. Clement Danes and St. Mary le Strand, as are not within any of the Four Wards of the Liberty of the Duchy of Lancaster, called the Temple-Bar Ward, the Royal Ward, the Middle Ward, and Precinct of the Savoy."
