And the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Master, or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Vessel, of his having received the said Licence, so indorsed as before directed, and to transmit the fame to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom such Licence was granted.
