

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS it has been reprefented to His Majefty at this Board, that the malignant and contagious Fever of the Nature of the Plague, which fome Time fince manifested itself at Philadelphia, in the State of Penfylvania, and in certain Towns of the State of New Jerfey, in the United States of America, has totally ceafed; His Majefty taking the fame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, fo far as may be confiftent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid, by His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing Date the Sixth Day of November, 1793, upon all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandize, arriving or to arrive from any of the Ports of the State of Penfylvania, or of the State of Delaware, or of the State of New Jerley, in the United States of Amefica, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in cafe fuch Order of the Sixth Day of November, 1793, had not been made, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithflanding : - And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the

Cinque Ports, the Mafter General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief of the Isles of Jerley, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein; as to them may respectively appertain. W. Fawkener.
