A Letter, of which the following is a Copy, from the Right Honorable Lord Hood, Vice-Admiral of the Red, and Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships in the Mediterranean, was this Day received at this Office.

Victory, Hieries Bay, Jan. 22, 1794.

S I R,

I Herewith have the Honor to transmit you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Narrative of the fortunate Preservation of His Majesty's Ship Juno, owing to the great Presence of Mind and zealous Exertion of Captain Hood, his Officers and Ship's Company.

MY LORD,

I Beg Leave to inclose your Lordship a Narrative of the fortunate Escape of His Majesty's Ship Juno, under my Command, from the Port of Toulon, after having run ashore in the Inner Harbour on the Night of the 11th Instant.

The firm, steady and quiet Manner my Orders were carried into Execution by Lieutenant Turner, supported by the able Assistance of Lieutenants Mason and Webley in their respective Stations; the Attention of Mr. Kidd, the Master, to the Steerage, &c. with the very good Conduct of every Officer and Man, were the Means of the Ship's Preservation from the Enemy, and for which I must request Permission to give them my strongest Recommendation.
