Oats, or Oatmeal; and also import into any Port or Place in that Part of Antain called Scotland, and to take out of Antain, for Home Confirmption, any Double Larley, Peafe, Oats and Oatmeal, on Dayment of the fecond Low Duty only, mentic main the faid Table marked E. and no other.

Fr.1 whereas by an Order in Council, dated the Twenty-feventh Day of November last, it was ordered, that the faid Prohibition to export Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Cats, or any other Meal-Flour, Malt, Bread or Bifcuit made thereof, from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England; and alfo the faid Prohibidioa to export Peafs, Beans or Oats, or any Meal-Floor, Malt, Bread or Biscuit made thereof, from any Post or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and every Provision, Regulation and Exception respecting the faid Prohibitions in the faid Order mentioned and referred to, should be and continue in Force until the Fourth Day of March, 1794; and alio that the faid Permission to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and to take out of Warehouse for Home Confunption, any Foreign Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats or Oatmeal, and the faid Permiffion to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and to take out of Warehoufe for Home Confumption, any Foreign Peafe, Oats and Oatmeal, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only, in the faid Order contained, fhould be and continue in Force until the Fourth Day of March, 1794.

And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Week ending the Fifteenth Day of February, 1794, that the General Average Prices of Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatincal, in that Part of Great Britain called England, are above the Prices at which Foreign Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty specified in the faid Table marked E.; His Majefty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, purfuant to the Powers given by the faid ASt, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition to export Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Bifcuit made thereof, from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and every Provision respecting the faid Prohibition in the faid Order mentioned and referred to, fhall be and continue in Force until the Fourth Day of June, 1794.

And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Month immediately preceding the Fifteenth Day of February, 1794, that the General Average Price of Oats, in that Part of Great Britain salled Scotland, is above the Price at which Foreign

Oats are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty fpecified in the faid Table marked E.; His Majony, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, pursuant to the Powers given by the faid Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition to export Oats from any Fort or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and every Provifion, Regulation and Exception refpecting the faid Prohibition in the faid Order mentioned and referred to, shall be and continue in Force until the Fourth Day of June, 1794. And His Majefty, by and with the Advice aforefaid, hath thought fit further to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Permission to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and to take out of Warehouse, for Home Confumption, any Foreign Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Bear or Bigg, Oats or Oatmeal, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only, mentioned in the faid Table marked E. and no other, in the faid Order contained, shall be and continue in Force until the Fourth Day of June, 1794.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly.
