A Shock of an Earthquake was very lenfibly felt in this Capital on Thursday last, at about One o'Clock, P. M.

Whitehall, February 26, 1794. W Hereias it has been humbly reprefented to His Majesty, that, early in the Morning of Sunday the 19th of January laft, a large Gang of Smugglers, to the Num-ber of Forty or more, armed with Fire Arms, affembled in the Neighbourhood of Chriftchurch in the County of Southampton, for the Furpole of running and affifting in the landing of a Cargo of Foreign Spirituous Liquors and other uncuftomed Goods, out of a large Tub-Boat; and that John Williams and James Cammell, Two Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms, being cruizing in their refpective Boats on the Coaft near the faid Place, discovered the faid Tub-Boat; which appeared to be deeply laden, and attempted to make Seizure of the fame, acepty taken, and intempted to make service of the fame, but in fo doing they and their Boats Crew were repea-tedly fired at by the Smugglers on Board the faid Tub-Boat, and likewife by a Number of other Perfons of the fame Party, who were on the Shore for the Space of Three Hours, during which Time they were thereby prevented from approaching the faid Boat, and making Seizure thereof, until a Party of the South Hamp/bire Militia arriving, they were, with their Affifance, enabled to overpower the Smugglers and make Seizure of the faid Boat and Cargo, which confifted of upwards of One Thousand Four Hundred Gallons of Foreign Spirituous Liquors, befides Thirteen Bales of Tobacco.

And whereas Information having been given upon Oath of the above Facts, Two Perjons named Michael Bonner and John Woodgate have already been appre-bended and committed to take their Trial for the faid Offence at the Affizes to be holden at Winchester, in and for the County of Southampton : And whereas a Perfon named Nicholas Briggs, who is juppojed to be the Master of the faid Boat, Appears to have been One of the faid Gang at the Time this Outrage was committed; but the faid Nicholas Briggs, and the Reft of the Perfons concerned have not yet been taken.

His Majely, for the better differenting and bringing 10 Justice the faid Nicholas Briggs, or any other of the Persons concerned in this atrocious Offices, avio are not yet apprehended, is hereby pleased to promife His most gracious Parden to any One of them who shall difeover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, fo that any One or more of them may be apprehended and conwitted of the faid Offence.
