

Bank of England, March 15, 1794.

THE Court of Directors of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England give Notice, that a General Court will be held at the Bank, on Thursday next, the 20th Instant, at Eleven in the Forenoon, to consider of a Dividend.

And also that another General Court will be held at the Bank, on Tuesday the 8th of April next, from Ten in the Forenoon till Four in the Afternoon, for the Election of a Governor and Deputy Governor for the Year ensuing (which will be declared that Evening,) and the same Court will be continued, by Adjournment, and held at the same Place, and during the same Hours, on Wednesday the 9th of April next, for the Election of Twenty-four Directors, (which will also be one of the Quarterly General Courts appointed by the Charter); and the Election of the Twenty-four Directors will be declared as soon as the Scrutiny is over.

By an Act passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, no Person will be entitled to vote at the said Election, who shall not have been Six Calendar Months possessed in his own Right of the Stock for which he shall then give his Vote, unless the said Stock shall have been acquired or shall have come by Bequest, or by Marriage, or by Succession to an Intestate's Estate, or by the Custom of the City of London, or by any Deed of Settlement after the Death of any Person who shall have been intitled for Life to the Dividends of such Stock.
