An Act for augmenting the Militia.

An Ast to enable the Governor and Company of the Bank of Scotland further to increase the Capital Stock of the said Company.

An Ast for making certain navigable Cuts from the Towns of Buckingham, Aylesbury, and Wendower, in the Gounty of Buckingham, to communicate with the Grand Junction Navigation, authorized to be made by an Ast of the last Session of Parliament, and for amending the said Ast.

An AI for making and maintaining a navigable Canal from and out of the Canal Navigation from Manchefler, to or near African under Lyne and Oldbam, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, at the intended Aquidust Briefge in Dukinsists, in the County of Chester, to or near to Chapel Milton, in the County of Perby; and a Communication, by Railways or Stone Roads, from thence to Load's Knowl, within Peak Forest, in the said County of Derby; and a Branch from and out of the said intended Canal to Whaley Bridge, in the said County of Chester.

An Act for making a navigable Canal from or near Porthywain Lime Rocks, in the Parify of L'an blodwill, in the County of Salop, to or near Newsown, in the County of Montgomery; and also certain collateral Cuts from the jaid Caral.

An Act for extending the Wyrley and Essington Canal.

An AA for making and maintaining a navigable Canal out of and from the Warwick and Birmingham Canal, now cutting, or intended to be cut in the Parish of Budbrooke, in the County of Warwick, into the Oxford Canal, in the Parish of Braunston, in the County of Northampton.

An Act for altering an Act passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the First, intituled, An Act for making the Rivers Mercy and Irwell navigable from Liverpock to Manchester, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, by incorporating the Proprietors of the said Navigation; and to declare thier respective Shares therein to be Personal Estate.

An Ast to enable the Truflees for the Care of the Road, through the several Parishes of St. Michael, St. Alban, St. Peter, Shenley Ridge, and South Mims, in the Counties of Heriford and Middlejex, to purchase certain Buildings and Hereaitaments, for the Purpose of making a new Road at the Entrance into the Town of St. Alban.

An Act for amending, widening and keeping in Repair the Read from Norwich to Aylepham, in the County of Norfolk, and a certain Part of the Road leading from the faid Road, towards Holt, in the faid County.

An Act to enlarge the Term and Powers of Three Acts peofed in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, and the Tenth and Twenty-eighth Years of His prejent Majesty's Reign, for repairing the Road from Birmingham, in the County of Warwick, through Elmden, to a Lane leading by the

End of Stone Bridge, in the faid County.

An Ast for enlarging the Firm and Powers of an Act of the Twelfth Year of His present Majejiy, for repairing and widening the Road, from the Warwick Road, near Solihull, to the Guide Post in Kenkwood on and from Stone Bridge, to meet the aforefaid Road on

Baljuil Common, in the County of Warwick.

An AR for enlarging the Term and Powers of certain Acts of Parliament for repairing several Roads in the Counties of Warwick, Stafford, and Worcester, Jo far as relates to the Ludley District of the said Roads; and for amending certain other Roads in the

County of Stafford.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of Two Acts, of the Twenty fixth Year of King George the Second and the Eighteenth Year of His present wa-jesty, for widening and repairing the High Road leading from Northallerton to the South Wall of the Church Yard of the Town of Thirfk, and from the South-East End of the Street called Finkell Street, in Thirsk aforesaid, to and through the Town of Easingwold, in the County of York, to a Place called Burton Stone, near the City of York; and also the Road from Thirsk asoresaid to Topclisse, in the North Riding of the Connty of York.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of Two AAs, of the Tauenty ninth Year of King George the Second and the Thirteenth Year of His present Majesty, for repairing and avidening several Roads leading from the Town of Kington, in the County of Hereford, and other Roads within the faid County; and also for making, amending, widening, and heeping in Repair certain other Roads within the faid County, adjoining or lying near to the Roads comprized in the faid Acts.

AT the Court at St. Jame;'s, the 26th Day of March, 1794,

E R SE N The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS by an Act made in the Twentythird Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, " An Act for preventing certain 44 Instruments from being required from Ships belonging to the United States of America; and to give to His Majesty, for a limited "Time, certain Powers for the better carrying " on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects " of His Majesty's Dominions and the Inhabitants of the said United States;" which said Act has been continued by several subsequent Acts until the 5th Day of April, 1794. And whereas by an Act made in the Twenty-fourth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Ast to extend the "Powers of an Act, made in the Twenty-third Year 44 of the Reign of His present Majesty, for giving " His Majesty certain Powers for the better carrying " on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of " His Majesty's Dominions and the Inhabitants us of the United States of America, to the Trade and Commerce of this Kingdom with the British " Colonies and Plantations in America, with re-" spect to c rtain Articles therein mentioned," the Powers given by the said recited Act were extended to the Trade and Intercourse between this Kingdom and the British Colonies and Plantations in America, so far as the same might relate to Iron, Hemp and Sailcloth, and other Articles of the Produce of any Place bordering on the Baltic, which might be exported from this Kingdom; which last mentioned Act has also by several subsequent Acts been continued until the said oth Day of April, 1794.

And whereas by another Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to continue " the Laws now in Force for regulating the Trade be-" tween the Subjects of His Majelly's Dominions, and the Inhabitants of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, so far as the " same relate to the Trade and Commerce carried " on between this Kingdom and the Inhabitants " of the Countries belonging to the faid United " States," it is declared to be expedient, that the faid Act of the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, so far only as the same extends to the Trade and Commerce carried on between this Kingdom and the People and Territories belonging to the United States of America, and also that the faid Act of the Twenty-fourth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, should be further continued and be in Force; and it is thereby enacted, that the said Acts shall continue and be in Force until the 5th Day of April, 1795, and to the End of the then next Session of Parliament:

His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That any Unmanufactured Goods and Merchandizes, the Importation of which into this Kingdom is not prohibited by Law (except Tobacco, for which Provision is herein after made, and except Oil made from Fish, or Creatures living in the Sea, and Blubber, Whale-Fins and Spermaceri) and any Pig Iron, Bar Iron, Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Rofin, Pot-Ash, Pearl Ash, Indico, Masts, Yards and Bowsprits, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the United States of America, may be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, or in Ships built in the Countries belonging to the United States of America, or any of them, and owned by the Subtects of the faid United States, or any of them, and whereof the Master and Three-fourths of the Mariners at least are Subjects of the faid United States; or any of them; and may be entered and landed

in any Port of this Kingdom, upon Payment of such Duties as the like Sorts of Goods or Merchandize are or may be subject and liable to if imported in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any British Island or Plantation in America, notwithstanding such Goods or Merchandize, or the Ships in which the same may be brought, may not be accompanied with the Certificates or other Documents heretofore required by Law.

And it is further ordered, that all other Goods and Merchandize not herein before enumerated or described, the Importation of which into this Kingdom is not prohibited by Law, (except Snuff, for which Provision is herein after made) and also Oil made from Fish or Creatures living in the Sea, and Blubber, Whale-Fins and Spermaceti, being the Growth, Production or Manufacture of any of the Territories of the said United States of America, may be imported from thence into this Kingdom in British or American Ships, owned and navigated as herein before required, upon Payment of such Duties of Customs and Excise as are payable on the like Goods and Merchandize upon their Importation into this Kingdom from Countries not under the Dominion of His Majesty, according to the Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F. annexed to an Act passed in the Twenty-seventh Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for repealing the " feveral Duties of Customs and Excise, and grant-" ing other Duties in Lieu thereof, and for apply-" ing the said Du:ies together with the other Du-" ties composing the Public Revenue; for permit-" ting the Importation of certain Goods, Wares " and Merchandize, the Produce or Manufacture " of the European Dominions of the French King, " into this Kingdom; and for applying certain un-" claimed Monies remaining in the Exchequer, for " the Payment of Annuities on Lives, to the Re-" duction of the National Debt;" or by any other Laws in Force passed subsequent to the said Act, touching the Duties contained in the said Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F.; and in Cases where different Duties are imposed upon the like Goods imported from different Countries not under the Dominion of His Majesty, then that such Goods shall be imported upon the lowest Duties which by the faid Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F. are required to be paid on the Importation of any fuch Goods from any European Country not under the Dominion of His Majesty.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that all such Goods and Merchandize shall be intitled to the same Drawbacks as are allowed upon the Exportation of the like Goods and Merchandize when exported from this Kingdom, ac-

cording to the faid Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F. annexed to the before mentioned Act passed in the Twenty-seventh Year of His present Majetty's Reign, or according to any other Law in Force, passed subsequent to the said A&, touching Drawbacks. And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be allowed and paid the same Drawbacks and Bounties on Goods and Merchandize exported from this Kingdom to the Territories of the faid United States, or any of them, as are or may hereafter be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of the like Goods or Merchandize to any of the Islands, Plantations, or Colonies, belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in America. And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be allowed and paid the same Drawbacks upon the Exportation of any Sort of Foreign Hemp or Foreign Iron exported from this Kingdom into any British Colony or Plantation in America, or into the Territories of the United States of America, or any of them, as are or may hereafter be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of the like Sort of H-mp or Iron to other Foreign Parts; and all such Drawbacks and Bounties respectively shall be allowed and paid in the same Manner, and under the same Rules, Regulations, Rellrictions and Forfeitures, in all Respects, as such Drawbacks and Bounties are allowed and paid, or are subject and liable to by

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the said United States of America, may be imported in British or American Ships, owned and navigated as herein before required, upon Payment of the same Duties as Tobacco, imported by British Subjects from any British Colony or Plantation, is or may hereafter be subject to; and that any Snuff, being the Production or Manufacture of any of the faid Territories, may be imported in Manner before mentioned, upon Payment of fuch Duties as Snuff, being the Production or Manufacture of Europe, imported from Europe, is or hereafter may be subject to, and may be warehoused and again exported; subject respectively nevertheless to all and singular the Regulations of an Act made and passed in the Twentyninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for repealing the Duties on To-" bacco and Snuff, and for granting new Duties in " Lieu thereof:" And another Act passed in the Thirtieth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to explain and amend an Act " made in the last S ession of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for repealing the Duties on Tobacco and " Snuff, and for granting new Duties in Lieu

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, That any Rice, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the United States of America, which shall be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, in Manner above-mentioned, may, upon the Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Duty of Eight-pence the Hundred Weight, being Part of the Duties now payable on the Importation of Rice, be landed and warehoused (except as hereinafter excepted) under His Majesty's Locks, in such Warehouses as shall be approved of for that Purpose by the Commisfioners of His Majesty's Customs, or any Four or more of them, upon the Importer's own Bond for Payment of the Remainder of the Duties due and payable for such Rice, within Eighteen Months, according to the net Weight and Quantity of fuch Rice at the Time it shall be so landed: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure nevertheless, that upon the Importation of any such Rice into the Ports of London, Briftol, Portsmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Pool, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty to enter and land the same without Payment of any Duty whatever; in which Case such Rice shall be warehoused, under the joint Locks of His Majesty and the Proprietors, in fuch Warehouse or Warehouses as shall be approved of for that Purpose by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, or any Four or more of them, in that Part of Great Britain called England, and any Three or more of them, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland; every Expence attending which Warehousing shall be borne by the faid Proprietors: And that fach Proprietor or Proprietors, or his or their known Agent, shall from Time to Time, at all feasonable Hours, as Occasion may require, have free Accels to luch Warehouses, in the Presence of some proper Officer of the Customs, for the Purpose of skreening and shifting the Rice, to prevent it's receiving Damage. And that if any Rice, which shall be so imported from the Territories of the said United States into any of the Ports abovementioned respectively, and warehoused as aforesaid, shall be taken-out of the Warehouses wherein the same shall be secured, under the joint Locks of His Majesty and the Proprietors as aforesaid, for Home Consumption, the full Duties, due and payable by Law upon the Importation of such Rice into this Kingdom for Home Consumption, shall, previously to it's being taken out of such Warehouses, be paid to the Collector of His Majesty's Customs at the Ports where fuch Rice shall be so warehoused; but that such Proprietor, if he intends to export such Rice, shall have Liberty to export the same from such Warehouses respectively, under the usual Regulations, without

Fayment of any Duty whatever: Provided that the Exportation of any fuch Rice, hereafter to be warehouled, be made within the faid Space of Eighteen Months; and if not within that Period, that the full Duties, payable by Law upon the Importation of such Rice, be paid for the same, and not be afterwards drawn back: And that if any Rice which shall have been imported into any Port of this Kingdom, not herein before specially named, and shall have been warehoused upon the Importer's Bond, in Manner aforefaid, shall, within the Time herein before mentioned, be taken out of the Warehouse wherein it shall have been so secured, to be exported directly from thence, the Bond entered into for the Payment of the said Duties thereon shall be discharged and cancelled by Debenture or Debentures, made out and passed in the usual Manner, for the Quantity or Quantities of Rice duly exported. And if any Rice imported into any Port of this Kingdom, not herein before foecially named, and warehoused in Manner aforesaid, shall be taken out of any fuch Warehouse for Home Consumption, the Remainder of the Daties, due and payable by Law, shall, previously to it's being taken out of fuch Warehouse, be paid to the Collector of His Majesty's Customs at the Port where such Rice shall be so warehoused; and that such Paymoat shall be made, and the Warehouse cleared for such Rice hereafter to be warehoused within the said Space of Eighteen Months, otherwife the same shall and may be fold for the Duties, in like Manner, and under the same Rules, Regulations and Restrictions, as any other Goods are now directed by Law to be fold for the Duties.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
