HIS Day the Lords heing met, a Mcffage was fent to the Honourable Houfe of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt: Gentleman Uther of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majefly's Commiffion for declaring His Reyal Affent to feveral Acts agreed upon by beth Houfes, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable Houfs in the Houfe of Peers, to bear the Commiffion read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commiffion, impowering he Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the fail Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for graving to His Majefty certain Stamp Duties on Indentures of Clerkships to Solicitors and Attornies in any of the Courts in England therein mentioned.

An AZ for granting to His Majefly certain additional Duties on Bricks and Tiles made in or imported into Great Britain.

An AA for regulating the Postage and Conveyance of Letters by the Carriage called the Penny Post. An AA for granting Kates of Postage for the Con-

An AB for graning Kates of Poslage for the Conweyance of Letters and Packets between Great Britain and the Islands of Jersey and Guernsey, and within those Islands.

An AEI for augmenting the Militia.

An Act to enable the Governor and Company of the Bank of Scotland further to increase the Capital Stock of the faid Company.

An Ast for making certain navigable Cuts from the Towns of Buckingham, Aylefbury, and Wendower, in the Gounty of Buckingham, to communicate with the Grand Junction Navigation, authorized to be made by an Ast of the last Session of Parliament, and for amending the faid Ast.

An AA for making and maintaining a navigable Canal from and out of the Canal Navigation from Manchefter, to or near Afoton under Lyne and Oldbam, in the County Falatine of Loncafter, at the intended Aquiduel Briege in Dukinfill', in the County of Chefter, to or near to Chapel Milton, in the County of Iherby; and a Communication, by Ruilways or Stone Roads, from theme to Load's Knowl, within Peak Forefl, in the faid County of Derby; and a Branch from and out of the faid intended Canal to Whaley Bridge, in the faid County of Chefter.

An Act for making a navisable Canal from or near Porthynoain Lime Rocks, in the Parifu of L'ant blodwell, in the County of Salop, to or near Newtown, in the County of Monigomery; and aljo certain collateral Cuts from the faid Canal.

An Act for extending the Wyrley and Effington Canal.

An AA for making and maintaining a navigable Canal out of and from the Warwick and Birmingham Canal, now cutting, or intended to be cut in the Parifb of Budbrooke, in the County of Warwick, into the Oxford Canal, in the Parifh of Braunfton, in the County of Northampton.

An Act for altering an Act passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Maj. fly King George the First, intituded, An Act for making the Rivers Mercy and Inwell navigable from Liverpoel to Manchefter, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, by incorporating the Proprietors of the faid Navigation; and to declare thier respective Shares therein to be Personal Estate.

An AA to enable the Truftees for the Care of the Road, through the feveral Parifhes of St. Michael, St. Alban, St. Peter, Shenley Ridge, and South Mims, in the Counties of Heriford and Middlejex, to purchase certain Buildings and Hereal uments, for the Purpose of making a new Road at the Entrance into the Town of St. Alban.

An Act for amending, widening and keeping in Repair the Read from Norwich to Aylejaam, in the County of Norfolk, and a certain Part of the Road leading from the faid Road, towards Holt, in the faid County.
