The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by an Act made in the Twenty. third Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty, intituled, " An Act for preventing certain " Inftruments from being required from Ships " belonging to the United States of America; " and to give to His Majesty, for a limited " Time, certain Powers for the better carrying is on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects " of His Majefly's Dominions and the Inhabitants " of the faid United States ;" which faid Act has been continued by feveral fubfequent Acts until the And whereas by an 5th Day of April, 1794. A& made in the Twenty-fourth Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to extend the " Powers of an Act, made in the Twenty-third Year " of the Reign of His prefent Majelty, for giving " His Majefty certain Powers for the better carrying " on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of " His Majetty's Dominions and the Inhabitants # of the United States of America, to the Trade " and Commerce of this Kingdom with the British # Colonies and Plantations in America, with re-" spect to certain Articles therein mentioned," the Powers given by the faid recited Act were extended to the Trade and Intercourse between this Kingdom and the British Colonies and Plantations in America, fo far as the fame might relate to Iron, Hemp and Sailcloth, and other Articles of the Produce of any Place bordering on the Baltic,

T the Court at St. James's, the 26th Day of which might be exported from this Kingdom; wheih last mentioned Act has also by feveral subfequent Acts been continued until the faid 5th Day of April, 1794.

And whereas by another Act paffed in this prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled, " An Act to continue the Lawsnow in Force for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Dominions, and the Inhabitants of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, fo far as the " fame relate to the Trade and Commerce carried " on between this Kingdom and the Inhabitants of the Countries belonging to the faid United " States," it is declared to be expedient, that the kid Act of the Twenty-third Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, so far only as the same extends to the Trade and Commerce carried on between this Kingdom and the People and Territories belong. ing to the United States of America, and alfo that the faid Act of the Twenty-fourth Year's f His prefent Majefty's Reign, should be further continued and be in Force; and it is thereby enacted, that the Lid Acts shall continue and be in Force until the 5th Day of April, 1795, and to the End of the then next Seffion of Parliament:

His Majefty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That any Unmanufactured Goods and Merchandizes, the Importation of which into this Kingdom is not prohibited by Law (except Tobacco, iufor wch Provision is herein after made, and except Oil made from Fish, or Creatures living in the Sea, and Blubber, Whale-Fins and Spermaceti) and

any

any Pig Iron, Bar Iron, Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Rofin, Pot Afh, Pearl-Afh, Indico, Mafts, Yards and Bowfprits, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the United States of America, may be imported directly from thence linto any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in British build Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, or in Ships built in the Countries belonging to the United States of America, or any of them, and owned by the Subfects of the faid United States, or any of them, and whereof the Matter and Three-fourths of the Mariners at least are Subjects of the faid United States, or any of them; and may be entered and landed in any Port of this Kingdom, upon Payment of fuch Duties as the like Sorts of Goods or Merchandize are or may be fubject and liable to if imported in British-built Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any British Island or Plantation in America, notwithstanding fuch Goods or Merchandize, or the Ships in which the fame may be brought, may not be accompanied with the Certificates or other Documents heretofore required by Law.

And it is further ordered, that all other Goods and Merchandize not herein before enumerated or defcribed, the Importation of which into this Kingdom is not prohibited by Law, (except Snuff, for which Provision is herein after made) and also Oil made from Fifh or Creatures living in the Sea, and Blubber, Whale-Fins and Spermaceti, being the Growth, Production or Manufacture of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America. may be imported from thence into this Kingdom in British or American Ships, owned and navigated as herein before required, upon Payment of such Duties of Cuftoms and Excise as are payable on the like Goods and Merchandize upon their Importation into this Kingdom from Countries not under the Dominion of His Majefty, according to the Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F. annexed to an Act passed in the Twenty-feventh Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for repealing the " feveral Duties of Cuftoms and Excife, and grant-" ing other Duties in Lieu thereof, and for apply-" ing the faid Du ies together with the other Du-** ties composing the Public Revenue; for permit-" ting the Importation of certain Goods, Wares " and Merchandize, the Produce or Manufacture " of the European Dominions of the French King, " into this Kingdom; and for applying certain un-" claimed Monies remaining in the Exchequer, for " the Payment of Annuities on Lives, to the Re-" duction of the National Debt;" or by any other Laws in Force passed subsequent to the faid Act, souching the Duties contained in the faid Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F.; and in Cafes

where different Duties are imposed upon the like Goods imported from different Countries 1 of under the Dominion of His Majesty, then that such Goods shall be imported upon the lowest Duties which by the faid Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F. are required to be paid on the Importation of any such Goods from any European Country not under the Dominion of His Majesty.

And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that all fuch Goods and Merchandize shall be intitled to the fame Drawbacks as are allowed upon the Exportation of the like Goods and Merchandize when exported from this Kingdom, according to the faid Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F. annexed to the before mentioned Act paffed in the Twenty-feventh Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, or according to any other Law in Force, paffed fubfequent to the faid Act, touching Drawbacks. And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be allowed and paid the fame Drawbacks and Bounties on Goods and Merchandize exported from this Kingdom to the Territories of the faid United States, or any of them, as are or may hereafter be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of the like Goods or Merchandize to any of the Iflands, Plantations, or Colonies, belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in America. And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be allowed and paid the fame Drawbacks upon the Exportation of any Sort of Foreign Hemp or Foreign Iron exported from this Kingdom into any British Colony or Plantation in America, or into the Territories of the United States of America, or any of them, as are or may hereafter be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of the like Sort of Hemp or Iron to other Foreign Parts; and all fuch Drawbacks and Bounties respectively shall be allowed and paid in the fame Manner, and under the fame Rules, Regulations, Refirictions and Forfeupres, in all Refpects, as fuch Drawbacks and Bounties are allowed and paid, or are fubject and liable to by Law.

And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, may be imported in British or, American Ships, owned and navigated as herein before required, upon Payment of the fame Duties as Tobacco, imported by British Subjects from any British Colony or Plantation, is or may hereafter be fubject to; and that any Snuff, being the Production or Manufacture of any of the faid Territories, may be imported in Manner before mentioned, upon Payment of fuch Duties as Snuff, being the Production or Manufacture of Europe, imported from Europe, is or hereafter may be fubject to, and may be warehoused and again exported; subject re**f**pectively

fpectively neverthelefs to all and fingular the Regulations of an Act made and paffed in the Twentyninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, insituled, "An Act for repealing the Duties on To-"bacco and Snuff, and for granting new Duties in "Lieu thereof:" And another Act paffed in the Thirtieth Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to explain and amend an Act "made in the laft Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act for repealing the Duties on Tobacco and "Snuff, and for granting new Duties in Lieu "thereof."

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, That any Rice, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the United States of America, which shall be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, in Manner above-mentioned, may, upon the Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Duty of Eight-pence the Hundred Weight, being Part of the Duties now payable on the Importation of Rice, be landed and warehou'ed (except as hereinafter excepted) under His Majesty's Locks, in such Warehouses as shall be approved of for that Purpole by the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, or any Four or more of them, upon the Importer's own Bond for Payment of the Remainder of the Duties due and payable for such Rice, within Eighteen Months, according to the net Weight and Quantity of fuch Rice at the Time it shall be fo landed : But it is His Majesty's Pleasure neverthelefs, that upon the Importation of any fuch Rice into the Ports of London, Briftol, Portfmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Pool, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glafg .w, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty to enter and land the fame without Payment of any Duty whatever; in which Cafe fuch Rice shall be warehoused, under the joint Locks of His Majelly and the Proprietors, in fuch Warehoufe or Warehoufes as shall be approved of for that Purpofe by the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, or any Four or more of them, in that Part of Great Britain called England, and any Three or more of them, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland; every Expence attending which Warehousing shall be borne by the faid Proprietors : And that fuch Proprietor or Proprietors, or his or their known Agent, shall from Time to Time, at all feasonable Hours, as Occasion may require, have free Accels to fuch Warehoufes, in the Prefence of fome proper Officer of the Cuftoms, for the Purpofe of fkreening and fhifting the Rice, to prevent it's receiving Damage. And that if any Rice, which fhall be fo imported from the Territories of the faid United States into any of the Ports abovementioned respectively, and warehoused as aforesaid; shall be taken out of the Warehoufes wherein the fame shall

be fecured, under the joint Locks of His Majely and the Proprietors as aforefaid, for Home Confum-tion, the full Duties, due and payable by Law upon the Importation of such Rice into this Kingdom for Home Confumption, fhall, previoufly to it's being taken out of fuch Warehoufes, be paid to the Collector of His Majeffy's Cuftoms at the Ports where fuch Rice shall be fo warehoused ; but that such Proprietor, if he intends to export fuch Rice, thall have Liberty to export the fame from fuch Warehoufes respectively, under the usual Regulations, without Payment of any Duty whatever: Provided that the Exportation of any fuch Rice, hereafter to be warehoused, be made within the faid Space of Eighteen Months; and if not within that Period, that the full Duties, payable by Law upon the Importation of fuch Rice, be paid for the fame, and not be afterwards drawn back : And that if any Rice which shall have been imported into any Port of this Kingdom, not herein before fpecially named. and thall have been warehoufed upon the Importer's Bond, in Manner aforefaid, shall, within the Time herein before mentioned, be taken out of the Warehoufe wherein it shall have been so fecured, to be exported directly from thence, the Bond entered into for the Payment of the faid Duties thereon shall be discharged and cancelled by Debenture or Debentures, made out and paffed in the ufual Manner, for the Quantity or Quantities of Rice duly exported. And if any Rice imported into any Port of this Kingdom, not herein before fpecially named, and warehoused in Manner aforesaid, shall be taken out of any fuch Warehouse for Home Confumption, the Remainder of the Duties, due and payable by Law, shall, previously to it's being taken out of fuch Warehouse, be paid to the Collector of His Majefty's Cuftoms at the Port where fuch Rice shall be fo warehoused; and that such Payment shall be made, and the Warehouse cleared for such Rice hereafter to be warehoused within the faid Space of Eighteen Months, otherwife the fame shail and may be fold for the Duties, in like Manner, and under the fame Rules, Regulations and Refirictions, as any other Goods are now directed by Law to be fold for the Duties.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, and the Lords Commiftioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively ppertain. Stepb. Cottrell.
