The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by an Act made in the Twenty. third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, " An Act for preventing certain " Instruments from being required from Ships " belonging to the United States of America; " and to give to His Majesty, for a limited " Time, certain Powers for the better carrying on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects " of His Majesty's Dominions and the Inhabitants of the said United States;" which said Act has been continued by several subsequent Acts until the And whereas by an 5th Day of April, 1794. A& made in the Twenty-fourth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to extend the · Powers of an Act, made in the Twenty-third Year " of the Reign of His present Majesty, for giving " His Majesty certain Powers for the better carrying on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of " His Majetty's Dominions and the Inhabitants se of the United States of America, to the Trade " and Commerce of this Kingdom with the British & Colonies and Plantations in America, with re-" spect to certain Articles therein mentioned," the Powers given by the faid recited Act were extended to the Trade and Intercourse between this Kingdom and the British Colonies and Plantations in America, fo far as the same might relate to Iron, Hemp and Sailcloth, and other Articles of the Produce of any Place bordering on the Baltic,

T the Court at St. James's, the 26th Day of which might be exported from this Kingdom; wheih last mentioned Act has also by several subsequent Acts been continued until the said 5th Day of April, 1794.

And whereas by another Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to continue the Laws now in Force for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Dominions, and the Inhabitants of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, fo far as the " same relate to the Trade and Commerce carried " on between this Kingdom and the Inhabitants of the Countries belonging to the faid United "States," it is declared to be expedient, that the kid Act of the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, so far only as the same extends to the Trade and Commerce carried on between this Kingdom and the People and Territories belong. ing to the United States of America, and also that the faid Act of the Twenty-fourth Year : I His present Majefiy's Reign, should be further continued and be in Force; and it is thereby enacted, that the aid Acts shall continue and be in Force until the 5th Day of April, 1795, and to the End of the then next Session of Parliament:

His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That any Unmanufactured Goods and Merchandizes, the Importation of which into this Kingdom is not prohibited by Law (except Tobacco, iufor wch Provision is herein after made, and except Oil made from Fish, or Creatures living in the Sea, and Blubber, Whale-Fins and Spermaceti) and
