A Letter, of which the following is an Extract, was Yesterday received from H:s Royal Highness the Duke of York by the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesly's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, dated St. Amand, April 8,

1794. I nave received this Morning a Report from Count Walmoden, that the Enemy, having succeeded in sur-prizing the Hessian Posts at Tenbreuil, between Werwick and Ypics, got behind the Hanoverian Pickets, and cut them off. Succour, however, having arrived from Menin, the Enemy was driven back, and forced to re-cross the Lys, and to destroy the Bridge which they had made. Our Loss was One Man killed, One Officer and Seven Men wounded, and Three Office, and One Hundred and Forty-three Men taken Prisoners.

WHereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, on or about the 22d Day of March last, Two Letters, of which the following are Copies, hearing the Post Mark of Alnwick, were received by William Yielder, Esq. Mayor of Newcastle upon Tyne, written by some evil-disposed Persons, with a View to create unfounded Alarms, and to disturb the Public Tranquility, the Contents proving wholly untrue, and the Names of Two respectable Gentlemen of the County of Northumberland, appearing thereto, being forged, viz.

I have only Time to inform your Worship that a Number of Men landed this Evening from some French Privateers craizing off this Coast, and have carried away all the Cattle they could seize, and I apprehend they will do more Mischies. If there are any armed Ships at Shields I hope you will send them for our Protection, otherwise we cannot tell how far the Evil may extend.

I am extremely unhappy to trouble you with this Address, but the People in this Part of the Country are at present in such Consternation and Terror, that I have been requested by a great Number of my Neighbours to inform you, that a Descent was made this Evening near Bambrough, by a Number of armed

Men, from Three French Frigates cruizing near the Coast, who have carried off all the Cattle and Sneep from my Estate, and from many of my Neighbours near the Sea; they still remain and seem to threaten surther Depredation; and as we have no Military Force near us, we request that if it be in your Power to afford us any Protection, you will send it as speedily as possible; I have only just Time to send a Servant to Alnwick to meet the Mail, by which Conveyance I imagine it will reach you sooner than it would by an Express.
