**T**HE Letters, of which the following are Copies, were this Morning received from His Royal Highness the Duke of York, by the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

*Heights above Cateau,*

SIR, *April 26, 1794.*

**I**T is from the Field of Battle that I have the Satisfaction to acquaint you, for His Majesty's Information, with the glorious Success which the Army under my Command have had this Day.

At Day-Break this Morning the

Enemy attacked me on all Sides. After a short but severe Conflict we succeeded in repulsing him, with considerable Slaughter. The Enemy's General, Chapuy, is taken Prisoner, and we are Masters of Thirty-five Pieces of the Enemy's Cannon. The Behaviour of the British Cavalry has been beyond all Praise.

It is impossible for me as yet to give any Account of the Loss sustained by His Majesty's Troops. I have Reason to believe that it is not considerable.

The only Officers of whom I have any Account as yet, and who I believe are all who have fallen upon this Occasion, are, Major-General
