attemp iog anything. Ou Magiliatte in the mean time continue to raile men, and to do whatever chi- is necellary for our fecurity. The French parti-s pais frequently the Rhine, and make their incursions into the Country of Berg, from whence they return with good Booty.

Liege, Dec. 20. We have b en here in great alarm for fome days paft, occasioned by a report that was got among the people, that the French were coming to take Winter-quarters in this City, which was encrealed by the account we had that they were laying a Bridge over the River at Wefel, a d that 5 or 600 French were come into the Suburb of Au oy; but all is now over, and our Magilirates have agreed with the French Intendant to pay 50000 Crowns for this City and its Suburbs; which is very moderate to what the French demanded, viz. 50000 Crowns a month.

Hague, Dec. 20. The States of Holland having ferled the matter of Reduction of the Forces, are f-parated till the 3d of the next month; according to this reduction there will remain on foot 66 Troops of Horfe, 10 of Dragoons, and 600 Companies of Foot, reduced each to 55 Men with Officers. It is faid that the states have not only ren wed their inflances to the French Ambaffador for the obtaining a Neutrality for the City of Cologne, but have likewife refolved to employ their offices for the obtaining the inclusion of that City in the Peace. The States of Frizeland having deliberated a new apon the Point of their disbanding their Troops, have confirmed their first resolution upon that subject, and have fent a Letter to the States General to acquaint them therewith, that they may fave the Deputies they had refolved to fend to them on this occasion, the trouble of that journy, feeing it will be without any fiuit. From Nimeguen we have advice, that fince the exchange of the Ratifications of the Peace between Spain and France, the Negotiation between the Imperialis and the latter, has not advanced at all

Ditto, Dec. 23. The States having caufed complaint to be made to the French Ambaffador of an İmposition which is laid by the French upon all Putch Veffels that pals Fifet, the Ambaffador has answered that the King his Master will give orders that the Impofition shall not be required of the Dutch for the future, provided the States do withdraw out of the Country of Liege, fuch of their Troops, that are flill remaining there. Notwith-flanding the refolution of the States of Frizeland to perfift in their first resolution concerning the difbanding of their Troops, the States General have ordered their 1 eputies, whom they had before appointed to go and expollulate with those States on this fubject, to proceed on their journy, and to execute the inftructions given them in this Affair. The French we hear are drawing their Forces together in the Country of *Juliers*, and it is generally apprehended, that their defign is upon the City of that name, or elfe upon Cologne. The reduction of the Forces will be put in execution the beginning of the next/month. There will be re-formed 48 Troops of Horle, and there, will remain on foot 66, of 50 men each; 10 Troops of Dragoons are to be reformed, and to to remain of 60 men cach; and all the foot Companies, which are 60 t, are to be reduced to 55 men each, including the Officers, excepting the Princes Horfe and Foot-

guarde, which are to confine on the fame fost they are now on.

Paris, Dec. 21. The Dutch Ambaffadors have, as we us derfland, received an answer in writing to the inflances they made by the order of the States their Malters, for a Neutrality for Cleves and Fuliers, by which the King repeats what had been before fignified to them by word of mouth, of his not thinking fit to confent thereunto. The faid Ambaffadors are it feems diffatisfied with Monfieur de Pompone's treatment of them, who in the visit they made him, brought them only to his Stairs head, whereas the Ambaffadors expected he fhould have accompanied them to their Coach; and befides, he has not yet returned their Vifit, and has let them know he does not intend to do it, till after they have made their publick Entry, for which they are preparing. The Sieurs Boreel and Dickvelt will have 24 Footmen and Pages in the Livery of the States and the Sieur Odyke will have as many in that of the Prince of Orange; fo that they will make a very gallant appearance. The Sieur Odyke being fome days fince at Court, met in the Kings Anti-chamber Monfieur Mombas, who was formerly in the fervice of the tates, and came over to the French in the beginning of the late War, and had fome tharp words with him. On Tuefday night, ari ived here an Express from Nimeguen, who brought the Sparifh Ratifications of the late concluded Reace with that Crown, which will be published here on Monday next, and Te Deum fung in Noftre Dame with the ufual folemnity.

Ditto, Dec. 24. From the Rhine we have an account, that the Kings Troops poffels themfelves of all the Posts about Cologne; that they have lately burnt two or three V liages, who were wanting to pay their Contributions; that they have a Pais on the Rhine, and that they flop all Veffels that pais, in order to the making a Bridge over that River. The Mareschal de Crequi is still at Nancy, though we are told that he has leave to return hither, the Sieur, de Monclar beirg appointed by the King to command his Troops that Winter in Alface. It is faid that, Monficur Pompone has made certain Propofals to the Dutch Ambaffadors about the affairs of the North, and that their Excellencies have feat an Express to the Hague, to give their Maffers an account there-The Negotiation between the Imperial and of. French Amballadors at Nimeg en, has of late advanced very little, though the Conferences are still continued between them. Monfigur de Vauban, one of the Kings chief Ingincers, is gone by the Kings order to raile a very firong Fortress or Cittadel at Longvic.
