IS Majesty having been pleased to appoint His Grace Douglas, Duke of Hamilton and Brandon, to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Lanerk; Henry Dake of Buccleuch to be Lord Licutenant of the Shire of Mid Lothian; Alexander Duke of Gordon to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Aberdeen; John Duke of Argyll to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Argyll; James Duke of Montrose to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Stirling; John Dake of Roxburghe to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Roxburgh; George Granville Levelon, Earl Gower Sutherland, to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Sutherland; Archibald Earl of Eglintoune to be Lord Lieutenant of the Sbire of Air; Francis Earl of Moray to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Elgin; Charles William Montagu, Earl of Dalkeith, To be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Setkirk; James Harl of Fife to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Banff; Archibald Lord Douglas to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Forfar; Sir Thomas Dundas, Baronet, to be Lieutenant of the Shire of Orkney; George Graham, Esquire, to be Lieutenant of the Snire of Kinross; and William Macdowall, Esq; to be Lieutenant of the Shire of Renfrew, in North Britain, they this Day severally took and subscribed the Oaths of Ailegiance and Abjuration, and also subscribed the Assurance, conformably to what is required by an Act passed in the First Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the First.

APROCLAMATION,

For apprehending Archibald Hamilton Rowan. G E O R G E R.

WHEREAS Archibald Hamilton Rowan, late of Rathcoffey in the County of Kildare in the Kingdom of Ireland, Esquire, was, in the last Hilary Term, committed to His Majesty's Gaol of Newgate in the City of Dublin in the said Kingdom, under a Sentence of the Court of King's Bench of the said Kingdom, of Imprisonment for Two Years, for publishing a seditious Libel:

And whereas the faid Archibald Hamilton Rowan has lately been charged with High Treason: And whereas Information on Oath has been received that the faid Archibald Hamilton Rowan did, in the Night of Thursday the First Day of May instant, make his Escape from the said Gaol:

We have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all Our loving Subjects to discover and apprehend, and cause to be discovered and apprehended, the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan, and to carry him before some of Our Justices of the Peace, or Chief Magistrates of the County, Town or Place where he shall be apprehended, who are respectively required to secure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice unto Our Privy Council, or One of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to the End he may be forth coming, and be dealt withal, and proceeded against, according to Law. And whoever shall discover and apprehend the faid Archibald Hamilton Rowan, and bring him before fuch Justice of Peace or Chief Magistrate,
