For apprehending Archibald Hamilton Rowan.

GEORGE R.

THEREAS Archibald Hamilton Rowan, late of Rathcoffey in the County of Kildare in the Kingdom of Ireland, Esquire, was, in the last Hilary Term, committed to His Majesty's Gaol of Newgate in the City of Dublin in the faid Kingdom, under a Sentence of the Court of King's Bench of the faid Kingdom, of Imprisonment for Two Years, for publishing a seditious Libel:

And whereas the faid Archibald Hamilton Rowan has lately been charged with High Treason: And whereas Information on Oath has been received that the faid Archibald Hamilton Rowan did, in the Night of Thursday the First Day of May instant, make his Escape from the said Gaol:

We have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all Our loving Subjects to discover and apprehend, and cause to be discovered and apprehended, the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan, and to carry him before fome of Our Jultices of the Peace, or Chief Magistrates of the County, Town or Place where he shall be apprehended, who are respectively required to secure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice unto Our Privy Council, or One of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to the End he may be forth coming, and be dealt withal, and proceeded against, according to Law. And wheever shall discover and apprehend the faid Archibald Hamilton Rowan, and . bring him before fuch Justice of Peace or Chief

Magistrate, or so discover him that he may be apprehended and committed, shall receive for Reward the Sum of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS; which faid Sum of One Thousand Pounds the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly.

W Hereas it has been represented to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, that in the Evening of the 23d Day of December lust a large Smuggling Cut-ter being observed cruizing off the Coast nearly opposite to the Town of Shoreham in the County of Suffex, the Galley belonging to the Swallow Cutter, in the Service of the Customs, was immediately manned by several of the Grew of the faid Ship, and rowed out of the Har-bour of New Shoreham, in Pursuit of her: That, as soon as they came along side of the Smuggling Cutter, which was about a Mile distant from the Shore, some Perfons on Board the faid Cutter called out, " Keep off," and immediately a Carriage Gun, loaded with Shot, was fired from her Stern, and another was directly afterwards fired from her Bow, and jeweral Musquets and Blunderbusses were fired from the Midships of the faid Cutter, by Means whereof Richard Blair, one of the Seamen on Board the Galley belonging to the Swal-low Cutter, received a mortal Wound in his Left Side, of which faid Wound the faid Richard Blair, after languishing for a few Days, on the 29th of the faid Month of December died.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Felony and Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One or more of the said Offenders who shall discover bis, her or their Accomplices therein, (except the Master or Commander on Board the fuid Cutter and the Persons aubo astually fired) so that any One or more of them may be apprehended and convicted of the faid Offence.
