A PROCLAMATION,

For apprehending Archibald Hamilton Rowan.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS Archibald Hamilton Rowan, late of Rathcoffey in the County of Kildare in the Kingdom of Ireland, Esquire, was, in the last Hilary Term, committed to His Majesty's Gaol of Newgate in the City of Dublin in the said Kingdom, under a Sentence of the Court of King's Bench of the said Kingdom, of Imprisonment for Two Years, for publishing a seditious Libel:

And whereas the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan has lately been charged with High Treason: And whereas Information on Oath has been received that the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan did, in the Night of Thursday the First Day of May instant, make his Escape from the said Gaol:

We have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all Our loving Subjects to discover and apprehend, and cause to be discovered and apprehended, the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan, and to carry him before some of Our Justices of the Peace, or Chief Magistrates of the County, Town or Place where he shall be apprehended, who are respectively required to secure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice unto Our Privy Council, or One of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to the End he may be forth coming, and be dealt withal, and proceeded against, according to Law. And whoever shall discover and apprehend the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan, and bring him before such Justice of Peace or Chief

Magistrate, or so discover him that he may be apprehended and committed, shall receive for Reward the Sum of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS; which said Sum of One Thousand Pounds the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly.

**W**hereas it has been represented to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, that in the Evening of the 23d Day of December last a large Smuggling Cutter being observed cruising off the Coast nearly opposite to the Town of Shoreham in the County of Sussex, the Galley belonging to the Swallow Cutter, in the Service of the Customs, was immediately manned by several of the Crew of the said Ship, and rowed out of the Harbour of New Shoreham, in Pursuit of her: That, as soon as they came along side of the Smuggling Cutter, which was about a Mile distant from the Shore, some Persons on Board the said Cutter called out, "Keep off," and immediately a Carriage Gun, loaded with Shot, was fired from her Stern, and another was directly afterwards fired from her Bow, and several Musquets and Blunderbusses were fired from the Midships of the said Cutter, by Means whereof Richard Blair, one of the Steamen on Board the Galley belonging to the Swallow Cutter, received a mortal Wound in his Left Side, of which said Wound the said Richard Blair, after languishing for a few Days, on the 29th of the said Month of December died.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Felony and Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One or more of the said Offenders who shall discover his, her or their Accomplices therein, (except the Master or Commander on Board the said Cutter and the Persons who actually fired) so that any One or more of them may be apprehended and convicted of the said Offence.
