Dispatch, of which the following is an Extract, dated Tournai, May 30, 1794, was Yesterday received from His Royal Highness the Duke of York by the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

AN Officer arrived this Evening, from Field-Marshall Mollendorf, with the News that, on the 23d, he completely surprized and surrounded the French Camp at Kaysers Lautern, killed above One Thousand Men and took Two Thousand Prisoners, besides Eighteen Pieces of Cannon, and all the Camp Equipage.

AT the Court at St. James's, the 7th of May,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS it is highly important to the internal Tranquillity and future Security of the Islands, or Territories, Parts of Islands, in the West Indies, which, since the Commencement of the present War, have been conquered by His Majesty's Arms, or surrendered to His Majesty, to prevent, during the Continuance of the faid War, too great a Refort to such Islands, or Parts of Islands, of Persons not Subjects to His Majesty, and particularly of such as are Enemies to His Majesty; His Majesty, taking the Premifes into His Royal Confideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That no Person, being an Alien, who shall have been a Subject of His late Most Christian Majesty, or shall be under the Government of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, shall refort or go to such Parts of the Island of St. Domingo as are or may be in the Possession of His Majesty, or to the Island of Martinique, or to any other Islands or Parts of Islands in the West Indies, Part of the Dominions of His late Most Christian Majesty, which are or may be in the Possession of His Majesty, during the said War, without special Licence first had and obtained from His Majesty, or from the Governor appointed by His Majesty, or, in his Absence, the Lieutenant-Governor so appointed, or the Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Forces at Jamaica or the Leeward Islands respectively, or some Persons or Person authorized to grant such Licence by His Majesty, or by fuch Commander in Chief at Jamaica or the Leeward Islands respectively: And it is further ordered, that no fuch Alien shall be permitted to land in any of the said Islands, or Parts of Islands, so in the Posfession of His Majesty, without such Licence as aforefaid: But nevertheless His Majesty is pleased to order. and declare, and it is hereby further ordered and declared, that nothing in this Order contained shall be construed or taken in any Manner to affect any Treaty or Capitulation made or entered into upon the Conquest or Surrender of such Islands or Parts of Islands respectively, or any Article or Thing in any fuch Treaty or Capitulation contained. the Governors and Lieutenant-Governors fo appointed by His Majesty in the said Islands and Parts of Islands, and the Commanders in Chief of His Majesty's Forces at Jamaica and the Leeward Islands respectively, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

Marechall Mollendorff, on the 24th Instant, farprized the Prench in heir Entrenchments in the Neighbourhood of Kriler autern, and defeated them with great Lofs. The Force of the French confided of about Twelve Thousand Men. They were posted behind the Defles of Otterbach, Hagelibach, and the Lauter. The Whole of this Country was covered

with Redoubts and Entreachments; feveral Dykes had been cut, and the Bridges were every where destroyed; while Three strong Positions were prepared, to facilitate their Retreat in case of Accidents. Loss of the French amounts to One Thouland killed, more than Two Thousand Prisoners, Eighteen Pieces of Cannon, and Two Howitzers. After the Engagement, Marechall Mollandorff established his Fiead Quaters at Winnweitler, and the Prince of Hohenloe In ollingen took Possession of Neustadt. The advalced Posts of the Prussian Army extend as far as Deux Ponts and Carliberg.
