of France or other the Countries, Territories or Places then under the Government of the Perfons exercifing the Powers of Government in France, while the Firms of fuch refpective Houfes have remained in North America, and transacted their ordinary Commercial Business with other Countries, and therefore the Commercial Intercourfe between His Majefy's Subjects in Great Britain and the Subjects of the faid United States, may be embarrafied by the Reitrictions contained in the faid Act, unlefs His Majefty shall, in purfuance of the Powers vefted in him by the faid Act of Parliament, give His Royal Licence and Authority to enable Perfons in Great Britain to do fuch AAs as fhall be neceffary for carrying on fuch Commercial Intercourfe with North America, notwithftanding the Reftrictions contained in the faid Act, fo far as may be confiftent with the general Intent and Purpofes of the faid A&. And whereas it has also been represented to His Majefty, that, from the extensive Effect of the foregoing Circumitances, confiderable Delay and Inconvenience may arife, in cafe it shall be requisite to obtain a fpecial Licence on every Occasion for such Purpose: And whereas by another AC paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for more " effectually preferving Money or Effects in the Hands " of His Majefty's Subjects belonging to or dispole-" able by Perfons refident in France, for the Benefit " of the individual Owners thereof," it is, amongft other Things, enacted, that in all Cafes in which His Majefty shall think proper to grant any Licence or Licences, general or fpecial, by His Sign Manual, Order in Council or Proclamation, to do any Act or Acts under particular Circumstances, or upon special Terms or Conditions expressed in such Licences refpestively, the Proof of the Existence of such Circumitances, and of the Performance of or Compliance with fuch Terms and Conditions, shall, in all Proccedings whatfoever, Criminal or Civil, lie on the Perfon or Perfons acting under fueh Licences refpectively, or claiming the Benefit thereof : His Majefty, taking the Premises into His Royal Confideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that it shall be lawful for any Perfon refiding or being in Great Britain to pay any Bill drawn in any Part of North America by any Houfe of Trade eftablished in any Part of North America, upon any Perfons or Perion in Great Britain, and to pay any Sum or Sums of Money on Account of any Houfe of Trade established in any Part of North America, notwithitanding any One or more of the Houfe of Trade by whom fuce Bill shall have been drawn, or for whose Ufe fuch Bill, or Sum or Sums of Money, shall be paid, shall have been, or shall be, wirhin any of the Dominions of France, or any Country, Territory or Place which was on the faid First Day of January, 1794, or which fince has been, or which fhall be, during the

faid War, and at the Time of fuch Act done, under the Government of the Perfons exercifing the Powers of Government in France : Provided fuch Bill fhall have been to drawn for the Purpole only of fome Commercial Transaction bona fide between fuch House of Trade to established in North America and some Houfe of Trade in Great Britain, or in fome other Part of His Majefty's Dominions, or in fome Country in Amity with His Majesty, or for the Purpole of fome Commercial Transaction with France, relative to Articles not prohibited to be exported from this Kingdom to France, and thall not have been drawn for the Purpole, directly or indirectly, of carrying on any Commerce, other than as aforefaid, with, or making or providing any Remittance to France, or any Country, Territory or Place which now is, or, at the Time of fuch Act done, shall be, under the Government of the Perfons excreifing, or who shall exercise, the Powers of Government in France :- And His Majefty is pleafed further to order, and it is hereby ordered, that it shall be lawful for any Perfon or Perfons, refiding or being in Great Britain, to fend, fupply, or deliver, and caufe or procure to be fent, fupplied or delivered, any Goods, Wares or Merchandiz:, to, for, or on Account of any Houfe of Trade in North America, notwithltandi: g any One or more Perfon or Perfons, engaged in fuch House of Trade, shall have been, or shall be within any of the Dominions of France, or any Country, Territory or Place, which was, on the 1st Day of January, 1794, or which fince has been, or which shall be, during the faid War, and at the Time of fuch Act done, under the Government of the Perfons exercifing, or who shall exercise, the Powers of Government in France.

Provided fuch Goods, Wares or Merchandize shall be so fent, supplied or delivered, bonâ fide for the fole Use and Benefit of such House of Trade in North America, and not for the Purpose, directly or indirectly, of carrying any Commerce with, or making or providing any Remittance to France, or any Country, Territory or Place which now is, or at the Time of such Act done, shall be, under the Government of the Perfons exercising, or who shall exercise, the Powers of Government in France.

Provided alfo, that all and every Perfon and Perfons who fhall take the Benefit of fuch Licence hereby granted, fhall fo take the fame, upon Condition that in cafe of any Proceeding, Criminal or Civil, under the Provifions of the faid Act of Patliament, for any Thing alledged to have been done contrary thereto, any Queflion fhall arife whether the Thing fo dore was authorized by the Licence hereby given, the Proof that fuch Thing was done under the particular Circumflances, according to the fpecial Terms and Conditions required by this Order, fhall lie on the Perfons claiming the Benefit of fuch Licence.
