P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 27th of November last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, expired upon the 7th Day of this instant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said 7th Day of this instant June, presume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twentieth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law of empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of

" Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:"—And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-sixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the

Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the said Month of February, 1793, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this instant June: And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the said Thirtieth Day of this instant June to the Thirty-first Day of August next, inclusive: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act made in the Thirty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for regulating the Importation and Exportation of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn exported," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, and He and They is and are thereby authorized, with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, at any Time when the General Average Price of any Sort of Corn or of Oatmeal, in England or Scotland respectively, taken as in the said Act passed in the last Session of Parliament is directed, shall appear to be at or above the Price at or above which Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour of the same Sort is allowed by Law to be imported from Ireland or the Province of Quebec, or the other British Colonies and Plantations in North America; at the first Low Duties specified in the Table marked

E. in the said Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, to prohibit generally, for a limited Time, the Exportation from England and Scotland respectively, as the Case may be, of any such Sort of Corn or other Articles mentioned in the said Acts; and in like Manner, at any Time when the Average Price of any Sort of Corn or of Oatmeal, in England or Scotland respectively, taken as in the said Act passed in the last Session of Parliament is directed, shall appear to be at or above the Price at or above which Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour of the same Sort is allowed by Law to be imported from any other Foreign Country at the first Low Duty specified in the said Table marked E. to permit generally the Importation into England or Scotland respectively, as the Case may be, or the taking out of Warehouse for Home Consumption, of any such Sort of Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour, on Payment of the second Low Duty only, and no other; and in the like Manner to recall such Prohibition or Permission, if Circumstances shall appear so to require: Provided always, that as often as the Importation of any Sort of Corn, Meal or Flour, on the Low Duties, shall be permitted by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, such Permission shall continue in Force for the Space of Three Months at least from the Date of the Order in Council made for that Purpose. And whereas, in pursuance of the Powers vested in His Majesty by the said Act, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, was pleased, by His Order in Council bearing Date the 28th of August, 1793, to prohibit (under the Provisions, Regulations and Exceptions therein mentioned and referred to) until the 30th of November then ensuing, the Exportation from any of the Ports of that Part of Great Britain called England of any Rye, Pease, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Oats; or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Biscuit made thereof; and in like Manner to prohibit the Exportation from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland of any Barley, Beer or Bigg, Pease, Beans, or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Bread or Biscuit made thereof; and also to declare and order, that from and after the Date of the said Order, until the Thirtieth Day of November then ensuing, it should be lawful to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and to take out of Warehouse for Home Consumption, any Foreign Rye, Pease, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats, or Oatmeal; and also to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and to take out of Warehouse for Home Consumption, any Foreign Barley, Pease, Oats and Oatmeal, on Payment of the second Low Duty only, mentioned in the said Table marked E. and no other.

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the Twenty-seventh Day of November, 1793, and by  
another

an other Order dated the 26th Day of February, 1794, the Prohibitions and Permissions in the said Order contained were to continue and remain in Force until the 4th Day of June, 1794; in the Manner in the said Two last mentioned Orders respectively contained.

And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Week ending the Seventh Day of June, 1794, that the General Average Prices of Rye, Pease, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, in that Part of Great Britain called England, are above the Prices at which Foreign Rye, Pease, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty specified in the said Table marked E.; His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, pursuant to the Powers given by the said Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition to export Rye, Pease, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Biscuit made thereof, from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and every Provision respecting the said Prohibition in the said Order mentioned and referred to, shall be, and the same is hereby revived and shall continue in Force until the First Day of October, 1794.

And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Month immediately preceding the Fifteenth Day of May, 1794, that the General Average Price of Oats, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, is above the Price at which Foreign Oats are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty specified in the said Table marked E.; His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, pursuant to the Powers given by the said Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition to export Oats from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and every Provision, Regulation and Exception respecting the said Prohibition in the said Order mentioned and referred to, shall be, and the same is hereby revived, and shall continue in Force until the First Day of October, 1794. And His Majesty, by and with the Advice aforesaid, hath thought fit further to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Permission to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and to take out of Warehouse, for Home Consumption, any Foreign Rye, Pease, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats or Oatmeal, on Payment of the second Low Duty only, mentioned in the said Table marked E. and no other, in the said Order contained, shall be, and the same is hereby revived, and shall continue in Force until the First Day of October, 1794.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for preventing Money or Effects, in the Hands of His Majesty's Subjects, belonging to or disposeable by Persons resident in France, being applied to the Use of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, and for preserving the Property thereof for the Benefit of the individual Owners thereof," all Persons, residing or being in Great Britain, are forbidden, under the Penalties of High Treason, during the present War, to pay, send, supply or deliver, or cause to be paid, sent, supplied or delivered, either in Great Britain or France, or in any other Country, either by Payment or Remittance of any Bill of Exchange, Note, Draught, Obligation, or Order for Money, or in any other Manner whatsoever, any Money to or for the Use of the Persons exercising, or who should exercise, the Powers of Government in France, or to or for the Use of any Persons or Person who, on the First Day of January, 1794, were or are, or, at any Time since, have or has been, or who, at the Time of such Act done, should be within any of the Dominions of France, or any Country, Territory or Place which was, on the 1st Day of January, 1794, or which should be, during the said War, and at the Time of such Act done, under the Government of the Persons exercising, or who should exercise, the Powers of Government in France:—And all Persons, residing or being in Great Britain, are also prohibited, under the Pains and Penalties of the Statute of Provision and Præmunire, during the said War, to send, supply or deliver, or cause or procure to be sent, supplied or delivered, either in Great Britain, or in any other Country or Place whatsoever, to or for the Use of the Persons exercising, or who should exercise, the Powers of Government in France, or to or for the Use of any Persons or Person who, on the said First Day of January, 1794, were or was, or at any Time since had been, or, at the Time of such Act done, should be, within any of the Dominions of France, or in any Country, Territory or Place which was, on the said 1st Day of January, 1794, or which should, during the said War, and at the Time of such Act done, be under the Government of the Persons exercising, or who should exercise, the Powers of Government in France: And all Persons residing or being in Great Britain are prohibited, under Penalties and Forfeitures specified in the said Act, to pay or satisfy in any Manner, during the said War, any Bill of Exchange, Note, Draught, Obligation or Order for Money, in Part or in the Whole, which, since the said First Day of January, 1794, has been, or, at any Time during the said War, shall be, drawn or accepted, or indorsed, or in any Manner nego-

ciated

ciated in, or in any Manner sent from any Part of the Dominions of France, or any Country, Territory or Place which was, on the said First Day of January, 1794, or at any Time during the said War, and at the Time of such Act done, shall be under the Government of the Persons exercising, or who should exercise the Powers of Government in France, or drawn, accepted or indorsed, or in any Manner negotiated by, or for the Use of, or upon the Credit of, or upon the Credit of the Effects of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, or of any Persons or Person who, on the said First Day of January, 1794, were or was, or at any Time since have or has been, or who, at the Time of such Act done, shall be, in any of the Dominions of France, or in any such Country, Territory or Place as aforesaid: And all Persons residing or being in Great Britain are prohibited, under the Penalties and Forfeitures specified in the said Act, to pay or otherwise satisfy, deliver or part with, any Money, Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, Draughts, Obligations or Orders for Money, Securities for Money, Goods, Wares, Merchandizes or Effects whatsoever, of or belonging to the Persons exercising, or who should exercise, the Powers of Government in France, or to any Persons or Person who, on the said First Day of January, 1794, were or was, or at any Time since have or has been, or who, at the Time of such Act done, shall be, in any of the Dominions of France, or in any Country, Territory or Place which was, on the said First Day of January, 1794, or at any Time during the said War, and at the Time of such Act done, shall be, under the Government of the Persons exercising, or who should exercise, the Powers of Government in France. And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty, that many Persons, who are Subjects of the United States of North America, and engaged in Houses of Trade established there, may have been, on and since the First Day of January, 1794, within the Dominions of France or other the Countries, Territories or Places then under the Government of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, while the Firms of such respective Houses have remained in North America, and transacted their ordinary Commercial Business with other Countries, and therefore the Commercial Intercourse between His Majesty's Subjects in Great Britain and the Subjects of the said United States, may be embarrassed by the Restrictions contained in the said Act, unless His Majesty shall, in pursuance of the Powers vested in him by the said Act of Parliament, give His Royal Licence and Authority to enable Persons in Great Britain to do such Acts as shall be necessary for carrying on such Commercial Intercourse with North America, notwithstanding the Restrictions contained in the said Act, so far as may be consistent with the general Intent and Purposes of the said Act.

And whereas it has also been represented to His Majesty, that, from the extensive Effect of the foregoing Circumstances, considerable Delay and Inconvenience may arise, in case it shall be requisite to obtain a special Licence on every Occasion for such Purpose: And whereas by another Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for more effectually preserving Money or Effects in the Hands of His Majesty's Subjects belonging to or disposable by Persons resident in France, for the Benefit of the individual Owners thereof," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, that in all Cases in which His Majesty shall think proper to grant any Licence or Licences, general or special, by His Sign Manual, Order in Council or Proclamation, to do any Act or Acts under particular Circumstances, or upon special Terms or Conditions expressed in such Licences respectively, the Proof of the Existence of such Circumstances, and of the Performance of or Compliance with such Terms and Conditions, shall, in all Proceedings whatsoever, Criminal or Civil, lie on the Person or Persons acting under such Licences respectively, or claiming the Benefit thereof: His Majesty, taking the Premises into His Royal Consideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that it shall be lawful for any Person residing or being in Great Britain to pay any Bill drawn in any Part of North America by any House of Trade established in any Part of North America, upon any Persons or Person in Great Britain, and to pay any Sum or Sums of Money on Account of any House of Trade established in any Part of North America, notwithstanding any One or more of the House of Trade by whom such Bill shall have been drawn, or for whose Use such Bill, or Sum or Sums of Money, shall be paid, shall have been, or shall be, within any of the Dominions of France, or any Country, Territory or Place which was on the said First Day of January, 1794, or which since has been, or which shall be, during the said War, and at the Time of such Act done, under the Government of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France: Provided such Bill shall have been so drawn for the Purpose only of some Commercial Transaction bona fide between such House of Trade so established in North America and some House of Trade in Great Britain, or in some other Part of His Majesty's Dominions, or in some Country in Amity with His Majesty, or for the Purpose of some Commercial Transaction with France, relative to Articles not prohibited to be exported from this Kingdom to France, and shall not have been drawn for the Purpose, directly or indirectly, of carrying on any Commerce, other than as aforesaid, with, or making or providing any Remittance to France, or any Country, Territory or Place which now is, or, at the Time of such Act done, shall be, under the Government of the Persons exercising, or who

who shall exercise, the Powers of Government in France:—And His Majesty is pleased further to order, and it is hereby ordered, that it shall be lawful for any Person or Persons, residing or being in Great Britain, to send, supply, or deliver, and cause or procure to be sent, supplied or delivered, any Goods, Wares or Merchandize, to, for, or on Account of any House of Trade in North America, notwithstanding any One or more Person or Persons, engaged in such House of Trade, shall have been, or shall be within any of the Dominions of France, or any Country, Territory or Place, which was, on the 1st Day of January, 1794, or which since has been, or which shall be, during the said War, and at the Time of such Act done, under the Government of the Persons exercising, or who shall exercise, the Powers of Government in France.

Provided such Goods, Wares or Merchandize shall be so sent, supplied or delivered, bonâ fide for the sole Use and Benefit of such House of Trade in North America, and not for the Purpose, directly or indirectly, of carrying any Commerce with, or making or providing any Remittance to France, or any Country, Territory or Place which now is, or at the Time of such Act done, shall be, under the Government of the Persons exercising, or who shall exercise, the Powers of Government in France.

Provided also, that all and every Person and Persons who shall take the Benefit of such Licence hereby granted, shall so take the same, upon Condition that in case of any Proceeding, Criminal or Civil, under the Provisions of the said Act of Parliament, for any Thing alledged to have been done contrary thereto, any Question shall arise whether the Thing so done was authorized by the Licence hereby given, the Proof that such Thing was done under the particular Circumstances, according to the special Terms and Conditions required by this Order, shall lie on the Persons claiming the Benefit of such Licence.

THIS Day the Right Honorable the Lord Mayor, the Aldermen, Sheriffs, and Common Council of the City of London, waited upon His Majesty (being introduced by the Right Honorable the Marquis of Salisbury, Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household) with the following Address, which was read by Sir John William Rose, Knight, Recorder.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled, humbly beg Leave to approach your Majesty with our warmest Congratulations on the late glorious Successes with which it has pleased the Divine Providence to bless your Majesty's Arms in different Quarters of the World, and more especially on the signal Victory obtained by the British Fleet, under the Command of Admiral Earl Howe, over the Fleet of the French, on the First of this Month.

We have the Pleasure of acknowledging, with heartfelt Satisfaction, that, by the Reduction of the principal Settlements of the French in the East Indies, and by the Capture of their West India Islands, the most valuable Commercial Acquisitions have been gained to your Majesty's Subjects, at the same Time that the Commerce of the Enemy has been destroyed in those Parts. And these Advantages are greatly enhanced, in our Estimation, by the amazing Rapidity and little Bloodshed with which they were accomplished.

We rejoice in seeing your Majesty's Arms victorious in the Reduction of Bastia, whereby not only the Corsicans are liberated from the Tyranny of French Anarchists, but our Fleets have acquired commodious Harbours in the Mediterranean.

We have viewed, with a peculiar Satisfaction, the glorious Exertions of our brave Countrymen, encouraged by the Example of their Illustrious Commander, and other Branches of the Royal Family on the Continent, in which your Majesty's paternal Feelings must have participated in an extraordinary Degree.

Deeply impressed with the Importance of these Advantages, we should think ourselves wanting in the Duty we owe to your Majesty, under whose mild Government we deem it our greatest Happiness to live, were we to delay taking the earliest Opportunity of testifying, at the Foot of the Throne, our most ardent Joy at the late signal Victory gained by your Majesty's Fleet over that of the Enemy; a Victory perhaps unexampled in the Annals of the British Navy, and which has materially reduced the Power of the French at Sea, adding Security to our wide-extended Commerce, and transmitting a most brilliant Example of British Valour to the latest Posterity.

And whilst we thus rejoice in the Successes of your Majesty's Arms Abroad, we desire to express our warmest Approbation of the Vigilance and Zeal of your Majesty's Ministers at Home, in repressing the Attempts of the Seditious, and those who wickedly aim at the Subversion of your Majesty's Government; and assure your Majesty, that your faithful Subjects, the Citizens of London, will continue to exert their most constant and earnest Endeavours to procure to themselves and their Posterity the secure and permanent Enjoyment of the invaluable Blessings of the glorious Constitution as established by Law.

May these brilliant Events convince your Majesty's Enemies of the Justice of your Majesty's Cause, and thereby the Blessings of Peace be restored to these Kingdoms.
