AT the Court at St. James's, the 18th of June,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 27th of November last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, expired upon the 7th Day of this inffant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majefly doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Mejetly's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this instant June, presume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coasswife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and foffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twentieth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to impower His Majesty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce " the Law ! impowering His Majesty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of

"Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His
"Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt"Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Am"munition:"—And the Lords Commissioners of
His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great
Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports,
the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary
Directions herein as to them may respectively
appertain.

The KING's Mon Excellent Majany in Council. THEREAS His Majesty was graciousty pleased, by His Reyal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, shat the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the
