Letter, of which the following is a Copy, A was this Morning received from His Royal Highnefs the Duke of York by the Right Honourable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

SIR, Renaix, June 24, 1794. COLONEL Craig had fet out upon his Journey to England - hit unformed to England ; but unfortunately, upon his Arrival at Oudenarde, he found that the Enemy had obliged General Clairfayt to retire in fome Confusion to Ghent; and that the Communication between that Place and Oudenarde, unlefs by a great Detour, was entirely cut off. Thinking that it was neceffary I should have this Information as soon as possible, he returned in the Night.

This Movement of the Enemy, by forcing General Clairfayt to retire, and bringing them nearer to the Banks of the Scheldt, rendered the Polition before Tournay, which, fince the Departure of the Prince Cobourg, had always been hazardous, no longer tenable; and I therefore quitted it this Day, leaving only a Garrifon in the Town, and marched, with all the British and Part of the Hessian Troops, to this Place, in order to be in Readinels to support Oudenarde, which was menaced, and actually iummoned this Day.

#### [, Translation. ]

ARTICLES of CAPITULATION proposed by Major-General Salis, Commandant of Ypres, to General Moreau, Commander of the Besieging Army before Ypres.

GENERAL Salis will deliver up to the General of Division, Moreau, the Town of Ypres, on the

following Conditions. Art. I. The Garrifon shall march out with the Honours of War, as well as all it's Military Attendants. Anfwer. Granted.

[ Price Two Shillings. ]

Art. II. The Garrifon fhall be allowed to carry with it all the Ammunition, Pieces of Artillery, and every Thing appertaining to the Army.

Answer. Refused. Art. III. The Garrison shall march out of the Town as foon as poffible, and on the Day to be agreed upon before the Signing of the Capitulation, through the Gate of Dixmude, or of Menin, in order to go to fuch Place as General Salis shall judge pro-per, with it's Arms and Baggage, Horfes, Drums, Matches lighted, Colours flying, and all the Cannon that it can carry away. Answer. The Honours of War shall be granted

to the Garrison, in Testimony of the brave Defence it has made: It shall depart by the Gate of Menin Twenty-four Hours after the Signing of the Capitu-lation; shall lay down it's Arms and Colours, after having passed the Glacis; and thall be fent Prisoner of War to fuch Part of the Republic as shall be affigned to it.

Art. IV. The other Pieces of Artillery shall be brought away in Eight Days after the Departure of the Garrison, as well as the Ammunition and Military Appurtenances.

Answer. Decided by the 3d Article. The Garrison alone shall retain it's personal Effects, and the Officers their Arms, Horfes excepted, which are to belong to the Republic, but the Value of which shall be reimbursed to them, according to the Esti-mate which shall be made. Horses and proper Carriages shall be provided gratis to transport them to their Defination.

Art. V. Four covered Waggons, that is to fay, which shall not be examined, shall be provided. Answer. Refused.

Art. VI. 'The convalefcent Soldiers, the fick Officers, and the proper Carriages to convey them, thall be also provided by the Beliegers. Answer. The Sick of the Garrison shall be treated

as the French, and shall become Prisoners of War on their Recovery

Art. VII. With respect to such Sick as shall not be able to bear a Carriage, they shall remain here in the Hofpitals, to be taken Care of at the Expence of the respective Troops, under the Superintendance of an Officer or Commissary ; and, as foon as the Sick shall be in a State to be conveyed away, Carriages fhall be provided for them.

Answer.

Answer. Decided by the Answer of the 6th Article.

Art. VIII. The Commiftarics, and every Perfon attached to the Imperial Service, under any Defeription whatfoever, shall be included in the Capitulation of the Troops, and fhall enjoy the fame Conditions.

Aniwer. The Commiffaries, and every Perfon attached to the Imperial Service, but not in a Military Capacity, thall depart from the Town, after having delivered to the Commission of the Republic the feveral Departments of Administration with which they are entrutted, and shall retire wherever they shall think proper, after being infpected by the Commandant of the Place, and having produced their Committions.

Art. 1X. Commiffaries shall be appointed on both Sides, to specify the Articles belonging to the Emperor, as well as all the Documents relating to the Artillery, the Fortifications, and Military Archives, as well of this Town as of every other Place be-loaging to the Emperor : The fame fhall be observed with respect to the Papers of all the Civil and Military Branches.

Decided by the 3d Article: Every Apfiver. Thing to belong to the Republic. Relponfible Officers thall be allowed to carry away, after an Examination, fuch Papers as may be necellary to them in fettling their Accounts.

Art. X. The Inhabitants of both Sexes, now in the Town, or who have taken Refuge therein, the Fublic Olicers, and all other Perfons, shall have their Honour, their Lives, and Properties, preferved.

Answer, Grasted, the French Emigrants excepted.

Art. XI. No Perfon shall be molested for their Opinions, whatever they may have been, nor for what they thall have faid or done lawfully, before and during the Siege.

Anf.ver. Granted. Art. XII. To fuch of the Inhabitants as shail chuse to retire elsewhere with their Effects, Pasiports shall be granted to travel in Safety.

Answer. Granted, after the Examination of their Effects by the Commiffaries of the Republic. Art. XIII. The Debts contracted by the Garri-

fon and Military, before and during the Siege, by all the Conflituted Authorities, as well those liquidated as those to be liquidated, thall be held lawful and fairly contracted.

Answer. Granted.

Art. XIV. A Post shall be granted and named to be delivered to the Befiegers, as foon as the Capitulation Ihall be figned and delivered to each Contrasting Party, under Condition that no Person of the Befiegers shall have Permission to come to the Posts which the prefent Garrilon still occupies, as also that no Perfon of the Befiegers shall come into the Town as long as the faid Garrifon shall remain there, except the Officers and Commissaries having Charge of the Assenal, Provisions, &c. in order to prevent any Misunderstanding between the different Troops.

As foon as the Capitulation shall be ac-Answer. cepted and figned, the Befingers shall take Poffeilion of the Gate of Bailleul; but no Perfon belonging to the Beslieging Army, except the Commission men-tioned in this Article, shall be allowed to enter the Town.

Art. XV. The Treasurers and Quarter-Masters of the Regiments, attached to no other Department, and not bearing Arms, shall not be confidered as Military; they shall be permitted to return to the Head Quarters, at which their respective Regiments were stationed in Peace, to arrange their Accounts, their Prefence with their Regiments not being requi-Site for any other Services.

Answer. Granted.

Art. XVI. The Hoftages deputed on each Side fhall remain where they are, until the Articles of the prefent Capitulation shall be completely executed.

Anfwer. Granted.

Art. XVII. Should any Difficulty occur in the Terms and Conditions of the Capitulation, as the I'wo Contracting Parties act with good Faith, the Terms shall be construed in the most ravorable Sente.

Anfwer. Granted : If any Additional Atticle fhall become necessary, they thall be made in Favor of the Befieged.

If any unimportant Point should be omitted in thefe Articles, it thall be fettled on each Side without Difficulty.

Anfwer. Decided by the above Article.

#### Article I.

PERMISSION is requested, from the General of Division Moreau, that a Copy of the Capitulation, which has been figued, may be fent to the Austrian, Commander in Chief, and another by the Heffians, to their Commanding Officer.

Aufwer. Granted.

Are the Horfes of the General and Staff' Art. II. Officers included among those that are to be left behind at the estimated Price ?

The General Officers having defired to Anfwer. keep Two Horfes each, their Request shall be complied with; all the others shall be valued, and paid for according to the Terms of the Capitulation. Art. III. Whether these Horses are to be given.

Anfwor. Decided by the preceding Article.

Art. IV. As the Olicers, when deprived of their Horfes, will be obliged to difinits their Servants, and as feveral Soldiers Wives may with to return Home, it is requested that the necessary Passports may be granted to them.

Anfwer. Granted.

As the Officers of the Battalions of Cal-Art. V. lemberg and Schroder threw themfelves into the Town without their Baggage or Horfes, they are de-firous to procure their Baggage, and request Per-mission to send form Persons furnished with Pasiports to bring it; and that these Persons on their Return may be protected by a finall French Efcort, and that Carriages may be furnished gratis for this Service.

Answer. Granted.

Art, VI. Whether the Garrifon is to march out To-morrow, and where it is to apply for the necesfary Horfes and Carriages for it's Keinoval?

Anfwer. Eighty-two Waggons shall be furnished to the Garrison for the Removal of it's Effects.

Art. VII. At what Hour is the Garrifon to begin it's March ? What Route is it to take ?

Aniwer. The Heilians fhall march out at Five. o'Clock in the Morning by the Gate of Bailleui, and shall arrive in the Evening at Caffel, and the next Day at St. Omer, where they will receive a further Route. The Remainder of the Garrison fhall, march out at Eight o'Clock by the Gate of Menin,

and shall arrive in the Evening at Lille, where it will receive a further Route.

Art. VIII. As each Officer, by the Military Regulations, is allowed to have One Servant, who belongs to fome Company, the Ollicers are defirous to keep thefe Servants with them, although they are included in the Mutter of Prifoners.

Anfwer. Granted : Thefe Servants, when an Exchange takes Place, to be reckoned as Prifoners.

Art. 1X. The General Officers request Permifion to keep their A 'jutants with them. Answer. Granted.
