The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 27th of November laft, for prohibiling the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, expired upon the 7th Day of this inflant June : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Mafter-General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any T'me during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this inftant June, presume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twentieth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to impower His Majefty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majefty to prohibit * the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of

" Arms or Ammunition; and alfo to empower His " Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife of Salt-" Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Am-" munition :"-And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majelly's Treafury, the Commifficners for execuing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports. the Mafter-General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. The KING's Molt Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS His Majefty was graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefly's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themselves as aforefaid, should reveive the Sum
