WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subyour City of Aberdeen, beg Leave to approach the Throne, and to teftify to your Majefty our molt fincere and heartfelt Joy on the repeated Succefics with which it has pleafed the Divine Providence to blefs your Majefty's Arms in the Courfe of the prefent just and necessary War.

The rapid and extensive Progress of the British Arms against the Common Enemy in the East and Weft Indies, as well as in the Mediterranean, and particularly the late glorious and decifive Victory obtained by the British over the French Fleet, by the able and gallant Conduct of Admiral Earl Howe, upon the First of this Month, are all Events in themfelves fo truly noble and confpicuous, and have been attended with fuch Circumstances of Renown to your Majesty's Fleets and Armies, as must for ever render them highly diffinguished in the Annals of the British

Empire.
