**T**HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

*An Act for more effectually preserving Money or Effects in the Hands of His Majesty's Subjects, belonging to or disposable by Persons resident in France, for the Benefit of the individual Owners thereof.*

*An Act to continue an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or resident therein, in certain Cases.*

*An Act to explain so much of an Act made in the Twenty-eighth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for the further Regulation of the Trials of controverted Elections or Returns of Members to serve in Parliament, as relates to the Time of presenting certain renewed Petitions, and taking the same into Consideration.*

*An Act for amending so much of an Act passed in the Thirteenth and Fourteenth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King Charles the Second, intituled, An Act for ordering the Forces in the several Counties of this Kingdom, as relates to the Militia of the City of London, and for the better ordering the same.*

*An Act for erecting a Penitentiary House or Houses for confining and employing Convicts.*

*An Act to continue, for a limited Time, and to amend an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act to continue, for a limited Time, and to amend several Acts of Parliament for regulating the Shipping and carrying Slaves in British Vessels from the Coast of Africa.*

The humble Address of the Provost, Magistrates and Council of the City of Aberdeen.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

**W**E, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Provost, Magistrates and Council of your City of Aberdeen, beg Leave to approach the Throne, and to testify to your Majesty our most sincere and heartfelt Joy on the repeated Successes with which it has pleased the Divine Providence to bless your Majesty's Arms in the Course of the present just and necessary War.

The rapid and extensive Progress of the British Arms against the Common Enemy in the East and West Indies, as well as in the Mediterranean, and particularly the late glorious and decisive Victory obtained by the British over the French Fleet, by the able and gallant Conduct of Admiral Earl Howe, upon the First of this Month, are all Events in themselves so truly noble and conspicuous, and have been attended with such Circumstances of Renown to your Majesty's Fleets and Armies, as must for ever render them highly distinguished in the Annals of the British Empire.

Whilst we thus rejoice in the Successes of your Majesty's Arms Abroad, permit us to express our warmest Approbation of the Vigilance and Exertions of your Majesty's Ministers at Home, in repressing the Attempts of the Seditious, and those who appear to have wickedly aimed at the Subversion of your Majesty's Government; and to assure your Majesty, that we will continue to exert our utmost Endeavours to preserve to ourselves and our Posterity the permanent Enjoyment of the many invaluable Blessings and Privileges of that Constitution under which we have the Happiness to live.

May the same signal Success continue to attend your Majesty's Arms in every Quarter of the World, until your Majesty shall be enabled to put an End to the present War, by the Establishment of a lasting and honourable Peace.
