The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-sixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the said Month of February, 1793, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so

that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this instant June: And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the said Thirtieth Day of this instant June to the Thirty-first Day of August next, inclusive: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

A Letter, of which the following is a Copy, has been received from His Royal Highness the Duke of York, by the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Head Quarters, Corthyke, July 10, 1794.

S I R,

SINCE writing my last Letter, I received a Report from Lord Moira, that, on the Morning of the 6th, the Enemy made an Attack upon the Out-Posts at Alost; the Picquets being driven in, they penetrated into the Town, but, upon his Lordship advancing

vancing

vancing with a Reinforcement, the Enemy retreated in Confusion. Enclosed I send the Return of the Killed and Wounded.

Lord Moira speaks highly of the Conduct and Spirit of the Officers and Men who were engaged upon this Occasion, and particularly of Lieutenant-Colonels Doyle and Vandeleur, who were both wounded.

The Troops under my Command quitted their Camp at Sempst on the 8th at Night, and arrived the next Morning at this Position.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The Address of the Guild or Brotherhood of the Trinity House of Kingston upon Hull.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, the Wardens, Elder Brethren and Assistants of the Corporation of the Trinity House of Kingston upon Hull, in Council assembled, humbly beg Leave to tender your Majesty our sincere Congratulations on the late signal Victory obtained by the British Fleet, under the Command of Admiral Earl Howe, over the Fleet of the French; a Victory as brilliant as the Annuals of the British Navy furnishes an Instance of.

And whilst we contemplate with sincere Satisfaction this and other glorious Successes, with which it has pleased the Divine Providence to bless your Majesty's Arms in both the Indies and the Mediterranean, we rejoice greatly in viewing the Ardour and Intrepidity with which the violent Conflict is sustained by your Majesty's Forces on the Continent; and, encouraged by the bright Example set by your Majesty, in not withholding those Branches of your Royal Family, who cannot but be most dear to your Majesty's Domestic Happiness, we are persuaded that your loyal Subjects cannot consider any Sacrifice on their Parts too great, in order to preserve the inestimable Blessings of our Constitution and Laws.

W Hereas it has been represented to the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, that in the Night of the 18th Ultimo, about Eleven o'Clock, a Luggar of about Thirty Tons Burthen, laden with Spirits and Tobacco, appeared off Sizewell, on the Coast of Suffolk; that being hailed, and required to shorten Sail by the Boat belonging to His Majesty's Excise Cutter the Lively, the said Luggar discharged a Volley of Musquetry into the said Boat, and continued to engage her with Small Arms for about Ten Minutes, when Two Men were wounded; that, upon the Boat returning with more Men, the said Luggar was found on Shore on Sizewell Beach, and immediately renewed the Firing, continued it for some Time, and wounded another Man; and that the Crew of the Luggar afterwards kept up a constant Fire on His Majesty's Cutter till about One o'Clock, when they quitted the said Luggar, and set her on Fire.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons under whose Direction or Conduct this Act of Violence and Felony has been committed, is hereby pleased to offer His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of the Offenders, who shall discover his, her or their Accomplices therein, (except the Master or Commander on Board the said Luggar) so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted of the said Offence.
