May it please your Majesty, WE, the Wardens, Elder Brethren and Assistants of the Corporation of the Trinity Houfe of Kingston upon Hull, in Council assembled, humbly beg Leave to tender your Majesty our fincere Congratulations on the late fignal Victory obtained by the British Fleet, under the Command of Admiral Earl Howe, over the Fleet of the French; a Victory as brilliant as the Annals of the British Navy furnishes an Inftance of.
