His Majesty having been pleased to deliver the Custody of the Privy Seal to the Right Honourable George John Earl Spencer, the Oath of Keeper of the Privy Seal was this Day administered to him, and his Lordship took his Place at the Board accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fifteenth of January, last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bow-sprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant July; and whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer: His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever

do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Twenty-fifth Day of this instant July, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bow-sprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores; or Ship or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council." But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty; or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance; or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Ex-
portation

portation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa; or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles, for the Purposes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Whitehall, July 19.

A Letter, of which the following is an Extract, dated Contyck, July 15, 1794, has been received from His Royal Highness the Duke of York by the Right Honourable Henry Dundas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

ON Saturday Afternoon the Enemy attacked all the Out-Posts occupied by my Advanced Corps in Front of the Canal leading from Brussels to Antwerp, and, being greatly superior in Numbers, drove them into the Town of Malines, upon which Place they likewise fired; but, upon a Reinforcement arriving, under the Command of the Earl of Moira, the Enemy fell back, with some Loss.

This Morning, however, they renewed the Attack, and having succeeded in obliging the Posts on

the Left of Malines to abandon the Canal, and to retreat from the Dyle, Lieutenant-General Dalwig thought himself obliged to fall back to Welhem, where he has taken up a Position, to cover that Pass of the River. I have detached Lord Moira to take Possession of the Village of Duffel upon his Left; and General Wallroden, with the Hanoverians, is at Lievre.

St. James's, Wednesday July 16, 1794.

A CHARTER of the Most Noble Order of the Garter having been summoned to meet this Day, the Knights Companions, in their Mantles and Collars, with the Officers of the Order hereafter mentioned in their Mantles, Chains and Badges, attended the Sovereign in his own Apartment; and, being called over by Garter, a Procession was made from thence to the Great Council-Chamber in the following Order:

Marquis of Stafford. Duke of Grafton.
His Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester.
His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales.
Black Rod. Garter.
Chancellor.

The SOVEREIGN.

The Sovereign and Knights Companions being seated, the Chancellor signified to the Chapter the Sovereign's Pleasure for filling up the two vacant Seats in St. George's Chapel at Windsor; and the Knights Companions proceeded to the Election. The Suffrages being collected by the Chancellor, and presented to the Sovereign, Prince William Frederick, (now out of the Kingdom) Son of his Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester, was, by His Majesty's Command, declared duly elected; and as, by the Statutes, none but a Knight can be elected, Garter and Black Rod were sent to introduce his Grace the Duke of Portland, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, who was knighted by the Sovereign with the Sword of State.

After which the Knights Companions proceeded to a Second Election; and the Suffrages being collected by the Chancellor, and presented to the Sovereign, the Duke of Portland was, by His Majesty's Command, declared duly elected. His Grace was thereupon received at the Door of the Chapter-Room by the two Junior Knights Companions, and conducted between them to the Sovereign, preceded by Garter King of Arms, (bearing the Ensigns of the Order on a Cushion) and Black Rod.

Garter King of Arms presenting the Garter to the Sovereign, His Majesty delivered it to the two Senior Knights, who buckled it on his Grace's Left Leg, the Chancellor pronouncing the Admonition.

Garter then presented the Ribbon with the George to the Sovereign, and his Grace kneeling, the Sovereign, with the Assistance of the two Senior Knights Companions, put it over the Duke's Shoulder, the Chancellor in the mean Time pronouncing the Admonition; and the Duke, having kissed His Majesty's Hand, and severally saluted the Knights present, withdrew.

Garter then called over the Knights; and a Procession was made back to His Majesty's Apartment, in the Order as before.

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Foreman and Brethren of the Grand Jury of the County of the City of Dublin, at Trinity Term assembled, beg Leave humbly to approach your Throne with heartfelt Congratulations on the late glorious and brilliant Success of your Majesty's Arms under the Command of that gallant and experienced Officer Earl Howe.

We fervently hope that the many and important Advantages obtained by your Majesty and your Allies may incline the deluded Inhabitants of France to sue for Peace; and that the Loyalty and Unanimity that prevail in these Kingdoms, may shew them the Madness and Impossibility of any Attempts to shake the Morals or Principles of Subjects who enjoy real Liberty, and whose King reigns in the Hearts of his People

We beg Leave to return your Majesty our grateful Acknowledgments for the continuing in the Government of this Country a Viceroy under whose firm (though mild) Administration, Outrage has been crushed; the national Strength called forth; the Vigour and Energy of the Law maintained; Public Credit upheld and extended, and such wise and salutary Acts passed, as entitle him to our fullest Confidence, and secure to your Majesty's faithful Subjects of this Realm the ample Enjoyment of that unparalleled System, the British Constitution.

To the KING.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the General Convention of the Royal Boroughs of Scotland, assembled in their annual Meeting, according to the ancient Statutes of this Realm, embrace this Opportunity of presenting at the Foot of your Majesty's Throne the warmest Tribute of the Zeal and Affection of our Hearts, to the Person and Government of one of the best Princes, that ever ruled over any Nation.

It is our Brast that in these evil Times, when the Attacks of our foreign Enemies have been traitorously seconded by the Conspiracies of domestic Foes, you, faithful Burghers, stand firm and unshaken in their Loyalty; and are at the Moment employed like true Patriots, in contributing every Aid that is in the Compass of their Abilities, in support of the Civil Power, and the Maintenance of the Executive Government of this Country.
