R E s B N T. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council: XTHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Fifteenth of January, Lett, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Lemp. Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Cars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty fifth Day of this inftant July; and whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefly's Service, and the Salicty of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer: His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the feid Twenty-fifth Day of this inflant July, prefume to trainport into any Parts out of this Kingtom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores; or Bip or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council. upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majelty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to ena-* ble His Majefty to reftrain the Exportation of Na-

* val Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Ex-" portation of Salt-Petre; Arms and Ammunition; " when prohibited by Proclamation or Old-r in " Council." But it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be confirmed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Service of His Majefty, or employed or freighted by His Majelly's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Mas jesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of fuch Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain; of the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being ; nor to the Lxportation of the faid feveral Aticles to Ireland; br to His Majesty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the Weft Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coalt of Africa; or to the Island of St. Helena, or the Britifh Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purpofes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yatds or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in America, of the Weft Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coak of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Ontwards
